E.E.F. in Palestine



- 2001** **E.E.F. in Palestine, 1917-1920**, a fascinating group of documents including a photo of Gen. Allenby (signed in the plate); a couple of postcards of EEF troops; March 20, 1919 copy of Palestine News Gazette with proclamation by Allenby; three passes to enter Palestine; hand-delivered telegram to the Grand Rabbi of Jerusalem; invitation to be present for the arrival of the High Commissioner for Palestine, etc. Ideal collateral material and increasingly difficult to find., F.-V.F. Estimate \$300 - 400



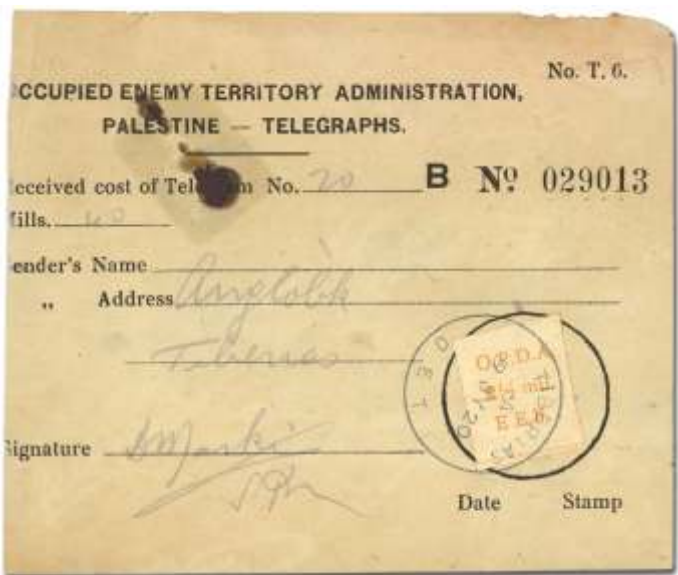

2005 ☒ **E.E.F. in Palestine, RPO cancellations, 2 items: RAK TPO Day Mail (Firebrace EFT6, VR) on March 18, 1917 GB 2d. registered formula env. from SZ15 to Alexandria; Kantara-Haifa TPO Sout (Dorfman D+, scarce), dated August 21, 1922, typing 2-5 m. London II stamps used to pay a postal infraction fine, a most unusual usage, Very Fine. Estimate \$250 - 350**



2006 ☒ **E.E.F. in Palestine, scarce cancellations, 5 items: Jaffa OETPA (Dickstein 8, C, scarce) on telegram, Feb. 2, 1920; Nazareth OET (Dorfman E+, very scarce), on official env. with "Military Government/Galilee" purple handstamp; Tiberias OET (Dorfman E+, very scarce), tying 2 1/2 mil OPDA revenue stamp to telegram receipt [rare usage]; 2 strikes, one red, one purple, of unlisted "Jerusalem Kaza Finance Dept. E.E.F." English-Arabic handstamp on receipt, one in Arabic, the other in Hebrew, dated 1919. Very unusual group., Very Fine. Estimate \$200 - 300**

2008 ☒ **E.E.F. "Postage Free" handstamp, 1919,** June 2 cover from FPO GM, HQ of EEF, to India with red two-line handstamp "Postage Free/E.E.F." Firebrace PFC 16, said to have been used at the 3rd Australian Light Horse Brigade FPO, rare, Very Fine. Estimate \$200 - 300



2010 ☒ **E.E.F. 1919 Emergency Flights, 2 covers:** the **only recorded cover** with a hand-written "Aerial Mail" docket, sent from Kantara to Cairo on the first day of the emergency service + the first day of service from Alexandria to Cairo with Firebrace EAM 1 two-line black handstamp "Aerial Post/EEF", slightly cut down on right not affecting markings, a very rare pair, F.-V.F. Estimate \$500 - 750

Wreck covers, 2 covers:** April 2, 1918 from SZ 28 to GB & late March 1918 (stamp with dat and APO # floated off) to Holland with "Opened by Censor/1212) tape on reverse, tied by Dutch arrival mark for Jul 4, 1918. Both have Firebrace MCH 3 purple boxed handstamp. They could have been carried on either the S.S. Kingstonian or the S.S. Warwickshire, a scarce pair, usual condition for such covers., Fine. Estimate \$200 - 300



2011 ☒ **Australian Forces in Palestine, 1917-9, 6 covers:** British single circle FPO DM2, Australian Mounted Div; LH2, 2nd Light Horse Brigade; double circle FPO T.M.1, all to Egypt + Australian FPO for 3rd Light Horse Brigade (2) & 4th Light Horse, reg. with pair of Australian 1d. engraved stamps (Sc. 17) and AIF reg. label, all to Australia, a difficult group, Very Fine. Estimate \$400 - 600



2012 **French Forces in Palestine, 1917** cover from Tresor et Postes 601A at Ramleh to Cairo, censored with purple boxed "Passed/Base Censor/E.E.F.", censor tape not tied, rare, Very Fine. Estimate \$200 - 300



2014 **French Forces in Palestine, 1918**, 2 covers from Tresor et Postes 601A at Ramleh to Port Said, with large black "F" handstamp censor mark & to Cairo with large blue "F" mark and hand-written censor statement, a rare pair, Very Fine. Estimate \$350 - 500



2013 **French Forces in Palestine, 1917**: 2 covers from Tresor et Postes 601A at Ramleh, one with contents, signed Sorani, the other with French censor tape, opened for display, both to Port Said through APO SZ 22, rare, F.-V.F. Estimate \$250 - 350



2015 **French Forces in Palestine**, undated cover from Secteur 601 to Saronia in Palestine via Secteur 601A (Ramleh), both manifested by large blue handstamps, presumably hand-carried, rare, Very Fine. Estimate \$250 - 350



2016 ☒ **French Forces in Palestine, 1918**, 2 items to Secteur Postale 601A: one franked with Palestine Sc. 2 used from SZ 44 (Jerusalem), with censor mark (front only), the other "Return to Sender" "Affranchissement Obligatoire" despite being marked "F.M." It was sent from Ismailia to a soldier and not accorded the free frank privilege, very unusual pair, Very Fine. Estimate \$250 - 350



2017 ☒ **Indian Forces in Asia Minor, 1915-8**, 11 covers: Egypt (3); Iraq (4, incl. India 2 1/2 a. reg. env.); Syria (2) & Turkey (1) + one indistinct, and Indian Field Service card (unused) + a set of Indian IEF overprints, Entwistle £220, F.-V.F. Estimate \$200 - 300



2018 ☒ **Indian Forces in Asia Minor, 1919** GB 2d. reg. env. used from Indian FPO 28 in Transjordan with unit reg. label, rare, Entwistle £100+, Very Fine. Estimate \$150 - 200



2019 ☒ **Indian Forces in Palestine, 1918-21**, 5 covers: R.M.S./I.E.F. (3, postcard to US, unfranked; 2 to GB, one front); FPO 20 honor cover to Egypt; FPO 395 used within Palestine + 1 Jerusalem 1 stamp used from FPO 20 and 11 Indian I.E.F. ovpts used from various offices in Palestine, Entwistle £205+, F.-V.F. Estimate \$250 - 350



2020 ☒ **Italian Forces in Palestine, 1917** Italian franchise card used from "Distaccamento Italiano di Palestino - Comando", with their purple round handstamp, 2 different Italian censor marks, rare, Very Fine; Sorani certificate. Estimate \$200 - 300



2023 ☒ **Italian Forces in Palestine, 1919** registered commercial cover from Egypt via SZ 10 in Cairo to a soldier of the First Company of the Italian Detachment in Palestine at Sarona, franked with Egypt Sc. 55, rare incoming cover, Very Fine. Estimate \$250 - 350



2021 ☒ **Italian Forces in Palestine, 1918** registered cover from "Distaccamento Italiano di Palestino - Comando" with their red handstamp, sent through SZ 34 near Ludd with 2d. GB stamp for registry, appropriately censored, Sorani certificate, very rare, Very Fine. Estimate \$400 - 600



2024 ☒ **Jewish Forces in Palestine using Indian FPO, 1919-20, 2 covers**, both from Indian FPO 83 that serviced the **First Judeans** at Ludd, both 2d. GB reg. env. one to Egypt, the other to Switzerland that required the addition of a 1 pi. Typo (Sc. 9) for the foreign destination, a very rare pair, F.-V.F. Estimate \$350 - 500



2022 ☒ **Italian Forces in Palestine, 1918** postcard sent from "Distaccamento Italiano di Palestino - Comando" with their red handstamp, through SZ 34 in Palestine (near Ludd) to Italy with appropriate censor marks, rare, Very Fine; Sorani certificate. Estimate \$200 - 300



2025 ☒ **New Zealand Forces in Palestine and elsewhere, 1917-9, 7 covers**: double circle FPO N.Z. (2, one to NZ); civilian postcard from Nazareth to an officer at N.Z.E.F. HQ in Cairo, franked with Mandate 4 m. Typo (Sc. 7); double circle FPO 2.W to NZ & 3.Z both on the Western Front; 1918 NZ Stationery Post Office #8 to NZ + 1917 Mounted Brigade/N.Z. Division, difficult group, F.-V.F. Estimate \$200 - 300

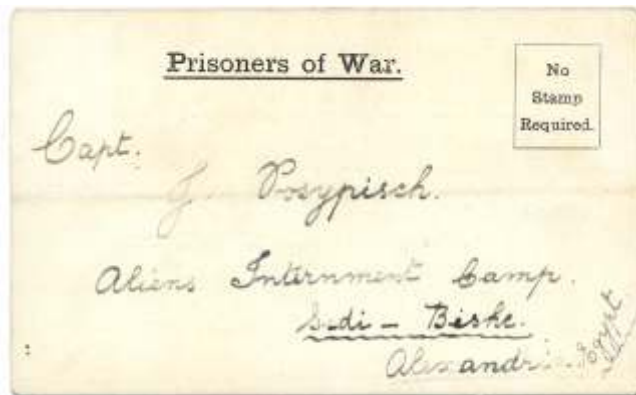
2026 ☒ **1918, 2 covers from Palestine to POWs in Egypt**, to internees at Sidi-Bishr, both franked with 1 pi ultramarine (Sc. 2), one from Jerusalem, censored in Palestine and Egypt; the other from Jaffa is registered, paid only with the 1 pi (Sc. 2) for registration with Egyptian censor tape at the top and the registry receipt attached. civilian internees were not normally afforded free franking so this pair gives an interesting insight into the vagaries of the early Mandate postal system, Very Fine. Estimate \$300 - 400



2027 ☒ **1918, cover from POW on Malta to Palestine**, formula folded letter from German civilian at St. Clements Camp on Malta to the American Colony in Jerusalem, censored in Malta, Egypt and Palestine, Very Fine. Estimate \$150 - 200



2028 ☒ **1918, Red Cross POW card from Austria to Bezalel in Jerusalem**, censored in Austria, Turkey and Palestine, a most unusual card, Very Fine. Estimate \$100



2029 ☒ **1919, folded formula letter card from POW at Helouan to another POW at Sidi-Bishr, Egypt**, Very Fine, such mail between POWs is exceedingly rare. Estimate \$200 - 300



2030 ☒ **1919, 2 covers from POWs in Egypt, to Palestine and Egypt**, one from POW at Camp Heliopolis through FPO GM2 to Palestine & cover from Camp Ras-El-Tin, Egypt to Alexandria with red straightline "From Prisoner of War" and two different censors, one from the Camp, scarce pair, Very Fine. Estimate \$200 - 300

2031 ☒ **1919, 2 covers to and from Palestine, POWs in Egypt**, folded formula card from a Frenchman interned at Camp Tura II near Cairo, written in French, to the Spanish Consul in Jerusalem + a cover with contents to an internee at Camp Tura I (somewhat tatty), scarce camp, F.-V.F. (no photo). Estimate \$200 - 300



2032 ☒ **1919, 2 folded formula letter sheets to Palestine from POWs in Egypt**, from internees at Camp Helouan, one from a German writing to the Spanish Consul in Jerusalem, the other has a purple boxed POW censor mark, Very Fine. Estimate \$150 - 200

- 2033 ☒ 1917-18, 2 registered covers to Palestine, handled by military postal service, from Denmark on 10 ore postal stationery uprated for registry to Jerusalem received at civilian post office in Alexandria, sent through BAPO Z, GM 1 (Bir Salem) to SZ 44 (Jerusalem) + another from Switzerland through BAPO Z, FPO GM1 to SZ 45 Jaffa, various censor markings and tapes, scarce pair, Very Fine (no photo). Estimate \$200 - 300



- 2034 ☒ 1917-18, 4 covers to Palestine, handled by military postal service, a triple censored cover from Egypt to Jerusalem with Italian/Egypt Red Cross label tied on reverse; double censored cover from GB to Jerusalem; U.S. War Department cover franked 1¢ + pr 2¢ Washingtons returned to sender, addressee could not be found, with a variety of handstamps, censored (wrinkled, piece missing lower right not affecting) + 1917 cover from Cyprus to Egypt with wavy Egypt censor handstamp, F.-V.F. Estimate \$200 - 300

- 2035 ☒ 1917 (Dec. 17), cover sent free from SZ 44 (Jerusalem) to Santiago, Chile, backstamped on arrival. Firebrace records 11 covers to Chile, not all from the same correspondence. First Day of the Service, 3-5 covers known on this date, censor label removed from reverse, central crease, F.-V.F. Estimate \$400 - 600



- 2036 ☒ 1917 (Dec. 17), two covers sent free from SZ 44 (Jerusalem) to Melipilla, Chile, backstamped Santiago and Melipilla, typing censor tape on reverse. Firebrace records 11 covers to Chile, not all from the same correspondence. First Day of the Service, 3-5 covers known on this date, roughly opened on right + a second cover with unreadable SZ 44 date but backstamped on March 12, the same date as the other two December 17 covers., F.-V.F. Estimate \$500 - 750



2037 ☒ 1917 (Dec. 19), postcard sent free from SZ 44 through SZ 10 (Cairo), to Bern, Switzerland, forwarded to Ulm, Germany, 2 censor marks on face, Very Fine. Estimate \$600 - 800

One of two recorded covers to Switzerland. The only known cover from this period to have crossed the lines. A major rarity.



2040 ☒ 1917 (Dec. 31), cover sent free from SZ 44 to Antofagasta, Chile, arrival backstamp ties censor label. It was charged 40 centavos on arrival (black boxed mark on face). These covers were not supposed to be charged postage due but they often were. Such treatment is much more common on covers to Egypt. This is one of two recorded covers so charged in Chile. Rare, F.-V.F. Estimate \$400 - 600



2038 ☒ 1917 (Dec. 24), cover sent free from SZ 44 to Talca, Chile, one of 11 recorded by Firebrace, backstamped on arrival, tying censor tape, Very Fine. Estimate \$250 - 350



2041 ☒ 1918 (Jan. 2), cover sent free from SZ 44 to the Armenian Secretary General in Cairo, Egypt, 2 censor marks on face, Very Fine. Estimate \$200 - 300



2039 ☒ 1917 (Dec. 31), cover sent free to Paris, France, last date of the 4 recorded by Firebrace, scensor stamp on face + tape, part of address excised, minor edge tears, rare, F.-V.F. Estimate \$400 - 600



2042 ☒ 1918 (Jan. 3), cover sent free from SZ 44 to Antofagasta, Chile, arrival backstamp ties censor label. The second of the 2 recorded taxed covers to Chile, this one "24" written into boxed postage due handstamp, roughly opened at right, not affecting, rare, F.-V.F. Estimate \$400 - 600



2043 ☒ 1918 (Jan. 7), cover sent free from SZ 45 to Alexandria, Egypt, earliest of the 5 recorded covers from SZ 45 to Egypt, Egyptian wavy censor handstamp on front. Taxed 5 mils, paid with 5 millésime Sphynx, file holes at left, not affecting, rare, F.-V.F. Estimate \$200 - 300



2045 ☒ 1918 (Jan. 12), cover sent free from SZ 45 to Ismailia, Egypt, with Egyptian "pi" censor mark on face, postage due charged and paid with 5 mil Sphynx, one of 5 covers recored to Egypt from SZ 45, Very Fine. Estimate \$250 - 350



2044 ☒ 1918 (Jan. 18), cover sent free from SZ 44 to Santiago, Chile, arrival backstamp ties censor label, one of 11 recorded covers to Chile, Very Fine. Estimate \$300 - 400



2046 ☒ 1918 (Jan. 24), cover sent free from SZ 44 to Cairo, Egypt, Paelstine, censor handstamp on face, postage due charged (handwritten in red at upper left) and paid with 5 mil Sphynx, flap missing; also February 5, 1918 cover sent free from SZ 44 to Cairo, Egypt, with Palesinte censor handstamp on face, postage due charged and paid with a 1 pi. Egypt postage due, charging the postage plus the fine. This pair of covers, to the same addressee, shows the vagaries of the postal system at the time, F.-V.F. Estimate \$400 - 600



2049 ☒ 1918 (Feb. 9), cover sent free from SZ 44 to Geneva, Switzerland. It was sent first to GB where on May 23 a KGV 2 ½d. stamp was applied by the Foreign Section, and the cover sent on the Switzerland, arriving May 26, censor label on reverse, Very Fine, the only such handling recorded by Firebrace, rare. Estimate \$600 - 800



2050 ☒ 1918 (Feb. 14), cover sent free from SZ 44 to Cairo, Egypt, sealed by censor. In this case, no postage due was charged even though the 1 pi EEF stamp had been issued 4 days earlier, latest recorded external cover to be treated as free, Very Fine. Estimate \$300 - 400

2047 ☒ 1918 (Feb. 6), cover sent free from SZ 44 to Cairo, Egypt, with Palestine censor handstamp on face, postage due charged and paid with a 1 pi. Egypt postage due, charging the postage plus the fine, Very Fine. Estimate \$250 - 350



2048 ☒ 1918 (Feb. 8), postcard sent free from SZ 45 to the U.S., with red Palestine censor handstamp on face, upper right corner repair, not affecting, F.-V.F., the only recorded cover from SZ 45 to the U.S. Estimate \$400 - 600

2052 ✉ **1918 (Feb. 28), cover sent pre-paid from D.M. 1 (Anzac Mounted Brigade), sent to GM 1 where 1 pi. blue (Sc 1) was applied and sent to SZ 32 (Bir Salem), censored, rare, Very Fine. Estimate \$600 - 800**



2053 ✉ **1918 (March), cover sent pre-paid from Hebron, sent to SZ 44 where a 1 pi blue (Sc. 1) was applied on March 2 and sent on to Egypt. Purple oval "Assistant Administrator O.E.T./Hebron" has manuscript. "1 P.E." receipt for pre-payment in cash, only recorded over from Hebron to Egypt, 2 censor handstamps on face, a bit scruffy but rare, F.-V.F. Estimate \$600 - 800**

2051 ✉ **1918 (Oct. 12), civilian letter from SZ 8 (Beirut) via Port Said to Cairo, posted free well after the free period was over; it was taxed with a pair of Egypt 1 pi postage due stamps for the postage and the fine, censored, most unusual, Very Fine. Estimate \$350 - 500**

EEF stamps were used as the British advanced north, arriving in Lebanon and the Syria in September. But stamps were not available until late November, thus the need for the prepayment system well after it was no longer available in Palestine itself.



2054 ☒ 1918 (Mar. 3), cover pre-paid at SZ 8 (Ramleh), sent to GM where a 1 pi blue (Sc. 1) was applied and sent to Mansura, Egypt via Cairo, censored, Very Fine, one of two recorded pre-paid covers from SZ 8, rare. Estimate \$750 - 1,000



2056 ☒ 1918 (June), cover sent pre-paid from Hebron, thence to SZ 44 where a 1 pi ultramarine (Sc. 2) was applied on June 9 and sent on to the U.S. Purple oval "Assistant Administrator O.E.T./Hebron" has manuscript. "1pi" receipt for pre-payment in cash, censor handstamp and tape on face, rather scruffy but rare, V.G.-Fine, only recorded cover from Hebron to U.S. Estimate \$500 - 750



2055 ☒ 1918 (Apr. 18), cover sent pre-paid from Rehovoth, through FPO H.M (Highland Mounted Brigade at Bir Es Salem), sent to GM 1 where a pair of 5m on 1 pi ultramarine stamps (Sc. 2) were applied and sent on to Cairo, Very Fine, only recorded cover from this FPO, rare; signed Sorani. Estimate \$1,000 - 1,500



2057 ☒ 1918 (June 10), cover sent pre-paid from Rishon-le-Zion to SZ 32 (Bir Salem), where 1 pi ultramarine (Sc. 2) was applied and sent on to Ismailia, Egypt, 2 censor marks on face, scarce, Very Fine. Estimate \$300 - 400

2062 ☒ 1918 (Nov. 19), cover posted to England in the Aleppo civilian post office, sent on to BAPO T for application of a 1 pi Typo (Sc. 9), thence via Port Said, censored, part of address excised, rare, Very Fine, only recorded pre-paid cover to England from Aleppo. Estimate \$400 - 600

2063 ☒ 1918, "E.E.F.", 1pi indigo, first day cover (SG 1a. Scott 1), February 10, 1918 cover to the U.S.; the first day of issue of the E.E.F. stamps used from SZ 44, this is the only recorded double rated FDC as well as the only one to the U.S. a major Mandate rarity (Bale \$2500++), Very Fine. Estimate \$2,000 - 3,000



2064 ☒ 1918, "E.E.F.", 1pi deep blue (SG 1a. Scott 1), used on March 1, 1918 cover from SZ 44 to Cairo, censored + Feb. 14 cancel on indigo shade tied to piece specifying "Printed Matter" which would make it a double weight franking, scarce pair, Very Fine. Estimate \$500 - 750



2065 ✘ **1918, "E.E.F.", 1pi deep blue (SG 1a. Scott 1),** used on March 8, 1918 from SZ 45 to Cairo, censored in Palestine and Egypt + a second cover with faint March cancel tying stamp, also to Egypt and double censored, Very Fine. Estimate \$500 - 750



2068 ✘ **1918, "E.E.F.", 5m on 1pi cobalt blue (SG 2. Scott 3a),** used on February 27, 1918 cover from SZ 45 to England, central horizontal crease not affecting, covers are much rarer than postcards, F.-V.F. Bale \$5,000. Estimate \$1,500 - 2,000



2066 ✘ **1918, "E.E.F.", 5m on 1pi cobalt blue (SG 2. Scott 3a),** used on February 26, 1918 postcard to Egypt, double censored, Very Fine. Bale \$2,000. Estimate \$400 - 600



2069 ✘ **1918, "E.E.F.", 5m on 1pi cobalt blue (SG 2. Scott 3a),** used on March 1, 1918 postcard to the U.S., double censored, a **scarce destination**, F.-V.F. Bale \$2,000. Estimate \$500 - 750



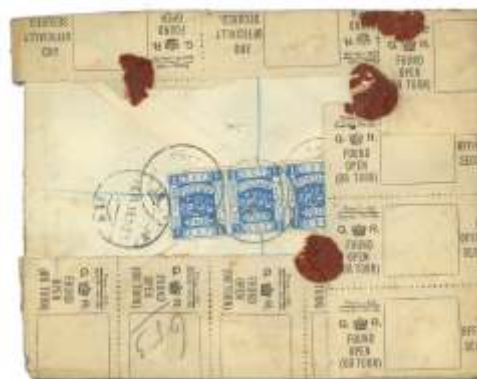
2067 ✘ **1918, "E.E.F.", 5m on 1pi cobalt blue (SG 2. Scott 3a),** used on February 26, 1918 postcard to Egypt, double censored, Very Fine. Bale \$2,000. Estimate \$400 - 600



2070 ✘ **1918, "E.E.F.", 5m on 1pi cobalt blue (SG 2. Scott 3a),** used on February 28, 1918 postcard to Egypt, double censored, F.-V.F. Bale \$2,000. Estimate \$400 - 600

2073 ☒ 1918, "E.E.F.", 1pi ultramarine (SG 3. Scott 2), used on 2 officially sealed 1918 covers: May 1 commercial registered to Netherlands franked with strip of 3 on reverse overpaying double weight registry, officially sealed in London before sending on to Amsterdam + November 14 cover to Cairo officially sealed in Egypt, both censored, a rare pair, F.-V.F. Estimate \$200 - 300



2072 ☒ 1918, "E.E.F.", 1pi ultramarine (SG 3. Scott 2), used on two 1918 covers: March 18 from SZ 44 to Colombo, Ceylon via Port Said, censored in Palestine and Ceylon, a rare destination + September 6 from SZ 45 to Switzerland, forwarded within Switzerland, censored in Palestine, Very Fine.
