Grading and Condition

Superb Extraordinary item in the finest condition.

Extremely Fine (XF) A stamp or cover of outstanding and exceptional quality.

These conditions, even if not described, are not grounds for return.

Featured Biography



ALFRED SOL LIPPMAN

Alfred Sol Lippman, unexpectedly passed at age 78, on October 17, 2016, in Baton Rouge, Louisiana. Mr. Lippman was born on June 12, 1938 in New Orleans, Louisiana and was a lifelong resident of Berwick/Morgan City, until moving to Lafayette, several years before passing. His family describes him as an amazing man: slow to anger and quick to forgive. Al, a most accomplished man both professionally and personally, would undoubtedly consider his 60 years of marriage to his wife Gail to be his greatest accomplishment. He was a 1956 graduate of St. Stanislaus College Prep, in Bay St. Louis, Mississippi and was Valedictorian of his class. Mr. Lippman attained his Undergraduate at the University of Southwestern Louisiana, Lafayette, La. (B.A.with Honors) - 1960 and his Juris Doctorate from Tulane University School of Law (recipient of full merit/academic scholarship) - 1962.

A world traveler who fancied exotic and exciting destinations, Mr. Lippman most loved his fishing and hunting with family and friends. He relished the

thrill of the hunt and the catch. This perhaps was the reason behind his great passion as a collector, always searching, seeking, hunting out the very finest acquisition for his many collections. His renowned knowledge and recall of history were encyclopedic. He was that one friend of a lifetime who respected others, lead with honor, and treated others with mercy and fairness. This dapper dresser was legendary in the behind-the-scenes world of politics and has left a lasting positive impression upon all whose paths he touched.



Harold Schachter DMD

Harold Schachter DMD was born in Yonkers, NY in 1936, and grew up in Trenton NJ with his sister Marilyn and mother Dorothy. He took much pride in the fact that his father, Julius Schachter, played solo violin for luminaries including Barbra Streisand and Frank Sinatra, among others. Harold met his wife Davida (Ivker), in anthropology class at the University of Pennsylvania, and they were married in 1959, while he was in dental school. He went on to serve in the US Air Force Dental Corps, and to attend the University of Illinois orthodontics program, before returning to NJ to practice.

Stamps were a passion of many decades for Harold, and he brought his usual attention to detail to amassing and cataloging his extensive collection. Harold pursued other interests with similar intensity, including playing and teaching bridge; a Sapphire Life Master, he and Davida served in retirement as bridge instructors for major cruise lines, enabling them to travel the world. Harold also

had a lifelong love of music, performing in dozens of community musical theater shows over roughly 40 years, before transitioned to directing, which enabled him to revel in coaching and encouraging other performers.



Machin trials discovered after 20 years

Sheets of three trials of the Machin head, produced in 1997, came to light in the 50th anniversary of the introduction of Arnold Machin's iconic portrait of Queen Elizabeth II.

The Machin definitives were first printed in lithography in 1980 as Royal Mail expanded its range of suppliers. However, by the mid-1990s it had decided that all the standard definitives should be printed in gravure. At the time The House of Questa, based in south London, did not have gravure capability.

As the company wished to participate in all future tenders for Royal Mail stamps, whether printed by litho or gravure, in gummed or self-adhesive versions in sheets or stamp booklets, it decided to make a major investment in a gravure press and an automated booklet maker. To achieve the best, Questa partnered with a number of highly qualified and renowned organisations to deliver the skills, processes and technology required to ensure it would be ready for production in less than 18 months.

Courvoisier, based in Switzerland, was at that time arguably the finest gravure stamp printer in Europe. The company agreed to assist Questa with technical advice and cylinder making. As part of this process Royal Mail gave permission for a print trial at Courvoisier using the Machin head: the original material to enable the trial to take place was supplied by Questa. Part of the thinking at the time was that Courvoisier might undertake the production of the cylinders needed for final stamp printing on behalf of Questa, but this did not materialise.

The undenominated trials were produced in October 1997 in sheets of 100 (from larger sheets of 200 guillotined in two) with the Courvoisier imprint along the vertical margins. They exist in three colours: deep green (as used for the 2p), light grey (as used at the time for the 29p), and flame (as used for 1st class). Courvoisier had printed the then current Kenya definitives, these being of the same overall size as the Machin definitives. As a consequence, the trials were printed on coated paper without phosphor bands, and have perforation 15 x 14. However, the stamp image is slightly smaller than that used on Machin definitives.

Barry Robinson, then Design Director of Royal Mail, visited Courvoisier to see the preparations. It is believed the trial sheets were printed on one of the small gravure printing presses at Courvoisier, some being printed during the visit. The gravure press and the automated booklet line were produced by ATN in France. The new machinery would not fit within Questa's original base in Camberwell: the move to Byfleet was part of the development.

Courvoisier was founded in 1880 and started printing stamps in 1937. It was noted for the high quality of its photogravure work, but sadly it ran into financial difficulties and ceased trading in 2001.

In the early 1800s, Conestoga wagons were the best method of transportation for travel and commerce. Under optimal conditions, 23 days were required to travel from Philadelphia to Pittsburgh. But, by the mid-1820s, the success of New York's Erie Canal system and its negative impact on Pennsylvania's trade business inspired the Pennsylvania legislature to authorize the construction of canals from Philadelphia to Pittsburgh. Unfortunately, the Allegheny Mountains lay between the two cities and the technology to build a canal system, either through or over the mountains, was lacking. The original plan involved building a four mile tunnel through the bottom of the mountains, but tunnel building was new and there were serious concerns about successfully maintaining an adequate amount of water in the tunnel. Thus, based upon a system being used in England, it was decided to build a railroad series of ten inclined planes, five on each side of the mountain. At the head of each inclined plane was a stationary engine, which moved endless ropes to pull the railroad cars up the mountain. This incline system had to be used because the locomotives of this time lacked the power to pull fully loaded cars up the steep mountains. Locomotives could only be used on the more level areas of the mountain.

The Allegheny Portage Railroad was 36 miles in length connecting the Hollidaysburg Canal Basin with the basin at Johnstown where canals finished the Public Works system into Pittsburgh. The Portage Railroad officially opened March 18, 1834, and reduced the travel time from Philadelphia to Pittsburgh to four days. The railroad and canal system successfully spurred trade in Pennsylvania. The system carried raw materials to the east and manufactured goods to the west. The Allegheny Portage Railroad and the Public Works system operated from 1834-1854 when it was replaced by the Pennsylvania Railroad Company's newly-completed all-rail line from Philadelphia to Pittsburgh.

The Pittsburgh Portable Boat Line was a private shipping line that carried freight along the Pennsylvania Canal system from Pittsburgh east to Philadelphia, and then on to New York, Baltimore, Boston, etc., and west to Cincinnati. The 82 feet long "portable boats" were built in three or four sections with each section watertight. The sections locked together to form a cplt boat, but were hauled separately - while still holding their freight - for overland transport, either by train or or teams of horses or oxen, to the next water route on the canal.
