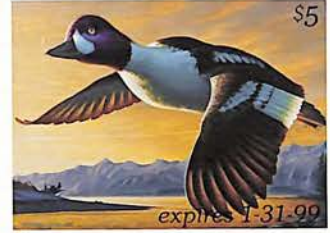

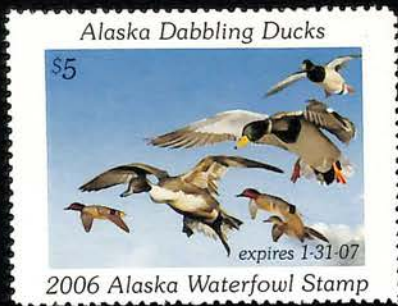

# 1985 "1st of State" Alaska Stamp Print

**ABOUT THE PRINT:** The Alaska "First of State" Waterfowl Stamp and Print will feature three Emperor Geese designed by Minnesota wildlife artist Daniel Smith. His original acrylic painting will be published as the first in an annual series to be issued by the Alaska Fish and Game Department. Daniel Smith's winning design will be reproduced in a limited edition of signed and numbered prints, with the edition size determined by the total number of confirmed orders received by Oct. 31, 1985. The design will be printed in full color on high quality acid-free paper using fade resistant inks. Image size 6 1/2 x 9", sheet size 12 x 14". Each print will be individually encased in a protective folio with artist's biography. The price of the 1985 "First of State" regular edition Stamp Print will be \$135.00. The mint stamp will be available at \$5.00.

**THE PROGRAM:** Emperor Geese heralds a significant new conservation effort in our 49th State. Authorized by the 1984 Alaska State Legislature, the Waterfowl Conservation Stamp program will generate funds for conservation and enhancement of waterfowl through wetland acquisition and related projects.

Sportsmen from 16-60 must purchase the \$5 stamp to hunt ducks and geese in Alaska. In addition, the Alaska Department of Fish & Game will receive a portion of the revenue from your print purchase. Funds generated by stamp/print sales could reach \$1 million, far above the \$76,000 budgeted for waterfowl management in '84. Appropriately, some of the new revenue will help to bring back the Emperor Goose, which in recent years has dwindled to an estimated 80,000 individuals.



**ABOUT THE MEDALLION:** To commemorate the "First of State" Alaska Stamp Print, a special medallion will be offered. This very collectible medallion has been designed personally by the artist. It will be approximately the same size as the stamp and is bronze with gold plating. The retail price for the signed and numbered medallion and print set is \$300.00 plus \$5.00 mint stamp. An Executive Edition of 250 prints will be offered with a medallion and color remarque. The Executive set will retail for \$750.00. Matching numbers will be available to continuing series collectors annually.

**ABOUT THE ARTIST:** Daniel Smith is no stranger to wildlife art conservation stamp programs, accumulating an impressive record in duck stamp competitions over the past years.

With his first place finish in the 1985 First of State Alaska Stamp Print contest, Dan is well on his way to establishing himself as one of the nation's outstanding wildlife artists.

His distinctive and original style, coupled with his creativity, will set new standards and directions in wildlife art.

In 1983 Dan won the Minnesota Pheasant Habitat Stamp Print.

Prior to becoming a full-time wildlife artist, Dan spent eight years in the commercial art field as an illustrator. This experience broadened his techniques and contributed greatly to his unique style. As important as technique is, however, nothing substitutes for an intimate knowledge of the subject and its habitat.

Dan's work has been selected for the prestigious Bird Art Exhibition at the Leigh Yawkey Woodson Art Museum in Wausau, Wisconsin. He continues to participate in the Minnesota Wildlife Heritage Show each year.

Dan and his family live near a small lake in Eden Prairie, Minnesota.

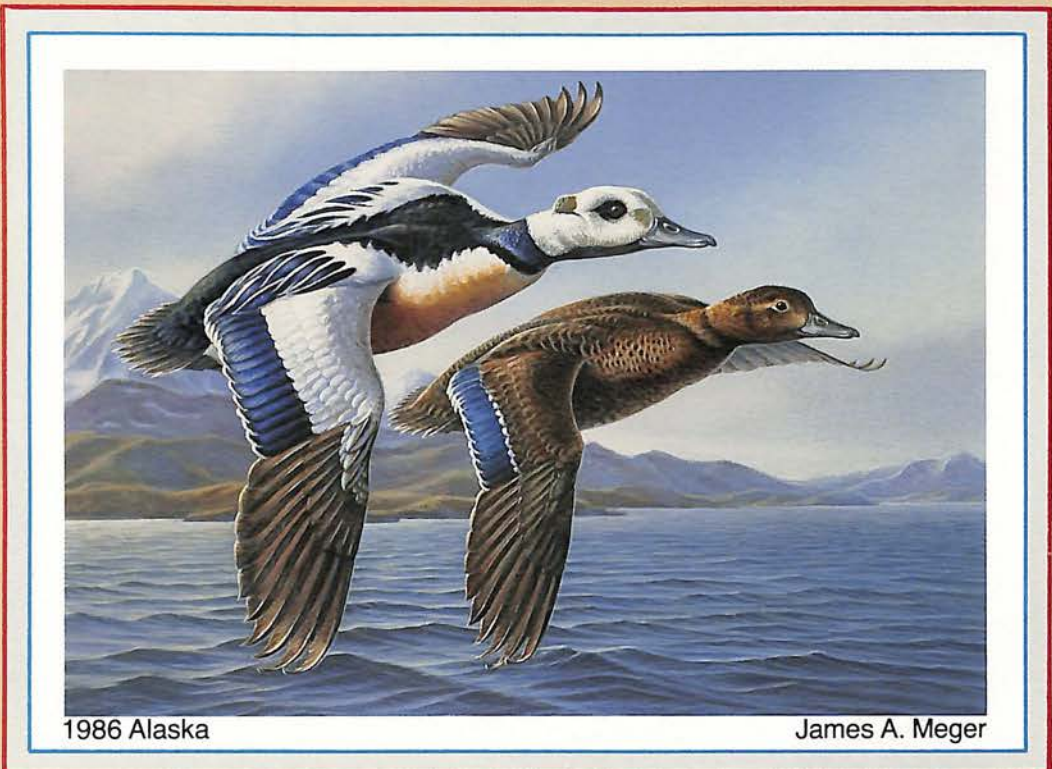

Sportsmen from 16 to 60 must purchase the \$5 stamp to hunt waterfowl in Alaska. In addition, the Alaska Department of Fish & Game will receive a portion of the revenue from your print purchase.

### "THE SPECIAL" MEDALLION SET

A special 24kt gold plated medallion (made with actual Alaska gold) and art print set will be available. The size of this edition will be determined by the number of orders received by October 18, 1986. The set is \$300, plus the stamp.

### THE EDITION

"Alaska II" will be printed on acid-free paper using special fade resistant inks. Image size: 6½ × 9 inches; paper size: 12 × 14 inches. The edition size will be determined by the number of orders received by October 18, 1986. Delivery will be in December 1986. A signed and numbered print is \$135 plus the \$5 mint stamp. A stamp signed by the artist is available for \$7.50 when purchasing the print.

**ABOUT THE 1986 ARTIST:**

James A. Meger has become one of the most popular wildlife artists of the 1980's. His work is characterized by unique compositions of popular wildlife subjects.

Since his win of the 1980 Minnesota Duck Stamp contest, Meger's limited edition art has been steadily increasing in collectability. In 1985 his career took major steps forward. He recently was chosen winner of the 1986 Minnesota Pheasant and 1986 Alaska Duck Stamp print competitions. Jim is the first artist to win both of Minnesota's major stamp print contests, the duck and the pheasant. Many feel that these contests rank second only to the federal duck competition in competitiveness and overall artistic quality of the entries.

As a conservationist, Jim Meger's generosity is well known. He has donated over \$500,000.00 in original art and prints to Ducks Unlimited Minnesota Waterfowl Association, Waterfowl Habitat, Inc., Pheasants Forever, the Wildlife Heritage Foundation and other conservation organizations.

Jim Meger is an artist on the way to the very top. With his determination and skill, it won't be long before his name becomes a household word with wildlife art collectors.

Daniel Smith

Daniel Smith's beautiful acrylic painting of Emperor Geese has become an important stepping stone in his young career. Selected as Alaska's 1985 First of State Waterfowl Conservation Stamp, the design has suddenly catapulted Smith into the national limelight.

But to folks in Minnesota, where Smith and his wife Liz, and two children make their home in Eden Prairie, the 30-year-old artist is not an overnight phenomenon.

Perhaps the most telling measure of his artistic growth has been his success at various wildlife art shows. He has been juried into the prestigious Birds in Art Exhibition at Leigh Yawkey Woodson Art Museum every year since 1981. In recent years, his work has been exhibited at the Easton Waterfowl Festival, Southeastern Wildlife Exposition, and the National Wildlife Art Show. In 1984, he took five best of show awards at various exhibitions, including the Minnesota Wildlife Heritage Art Show.

In 1982, officials with the National Geographic Society also recognized Smith's talent, commissioning him to paint five color plates for its Field Guide to North American Birds. The artist devoted many hours to the challenging project, examining hundreds of study skins, mounts, and photographs to create illustrations that would meet the exciting demands of the world's top ornithologists. The guide was published in 1983, the same year that Smith won the Minnesota "First of State" Pheasant Habitat Stamp.

Whether a field guide, conservation stamp, or one of his beautiful limited-edition prints, Smith will not begin a painting until he has observed and photographed his subject. "It's very important to spend some time learning everything about the animal, including its colors, habitat, personality, and how it interacts with other species," he says.

In recent months, the versatile artist has expanded his artistic universe to include mammals such as timber wolves and deer. He is also creating more extensive backgrounds that heighten the mood and atmosphere in his work. But unchanged are his intricate brushwork, dramatic lighting, and eye-catching composition, all hallmarks of an artist who ranks among the nation's finest.

## WATERFOWL CONSERVATION STAMP

This time Carl Branson was not able to study his subject in its natural habitat. So, with diligence and determination, Carl gathered what little is known about the mysterious Spectacled Eider. Using his research, Carl composed a stunning portrait of the male and female. His acrylic painting was judged the winner of the 1987 Alaska duck stamp contest . . . the first time an Alaskan had won the competition.

There were 39 entries from 17 states representing top

wildlife artists who accepted the challenge of presenting this rare bird. The Spectacled Eider has never been portrayed on a federal or state duck stamp before. It was designated as the 1987 species to continue the unique collection of Alaskan waterfowl. This third edition follows the very successful Emperor Goose and Stellers Eider editions. These first two stamps and prints generated over \$1 million for conservation projects in Alaska.

SPECTACLED EIDERS by *Carl W. Branson*

*One of the most popular state print series*

Alaska's unique waterfowl, presented in beautiful paintings, have made this series a favorite of collectors. They bring a refreshing new look to print collections. The Spectacled Eider is one of these interesting birds. This sea duck inhabits the west and northern coasts of Alaska and northeastern Siberia. It seldom crosses paths with man, few people outside



bird averages almost 21" in length. Although a diving duck, on its tundra breeding grounds it is primarily a surface feeder. Food consists of clams, crustaceans and aquatic insects.

When winter comes, it disappears into the limbo of the Bering Sea . . . the spectacled eider is an enigma of the waterfowl world. The beautifully detailed presentation by Carl is a delight-

Carl W. Branson of Peters Creek, Alaska is a private man with a quite sense of humor and a passionate love of nature. Wildlife art is a record of his impressions, but his prime commitment is to the preservation of the wilderness and wildlife. Born 50 years ago in Redwood City, California, an early rural life of hunting, fishing and trapping probably directed his artistic interest. Carl was caught in Alaska's spell while stationed there with the Air Force during the Korean War. In 1982, following seven years in Alberta, he moved his family to Peters Creek, near Anchorage.

## THE ARTIST



Carl has a comfortable life style and doesn't care much about recognition. Alaskans have enthusiastically accepted his work. Most of his art is in private collections throughout the state, as well as in Canada. Now, "Everything's changed, suddenly, overnight I'm a nationally recognized artist". But, Carl's avid collectors are thrilled, speculating on the value of paintings that had ranged from \$2,500 to \$8,000. Carl's masterful work is receiving well deserved recognition, he is about to take his place among our best known wildlife artists.

## THE PROGRAM

*The Alaska duck stamp is required for persons aged 16 to 60, to hunt in the state of Alaska.*

The sale of duck stamps to hunters and income from prints sold to art collectors provides a continuing source of funds for needed waterfowl conservation projects in Alaska. The Alaska Department of Fish and Game has developed plans for the use of these funds for habitat improvement and acquisition, increased waterfowl population, for research and public information projects.

In July of 1986, 200 Canada geese were transported from southeast Alaska to Kodiak, establishing a local breeding population where none had existed. Construction of a duck nesting area has begun on Creamer's Field State Game Refuge, near Fairbanks. It is funded jointly by Ducks Unlimited and state duck stamp funds. More projects are on the drawing board... they depend on your support of the program.

## SPECIFICATIONS
