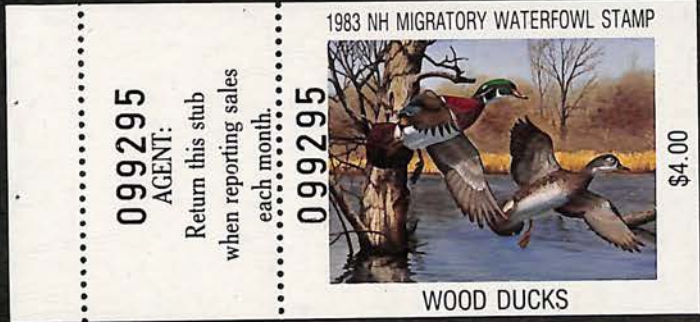

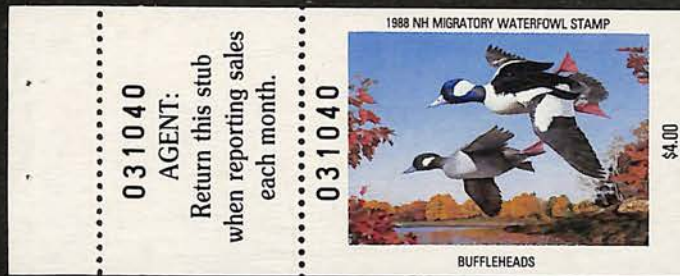

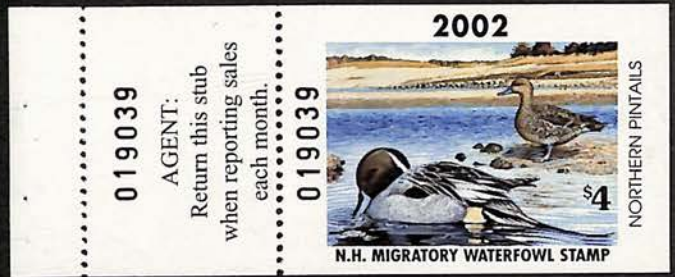

His awards and honors include winning artist of the 1985 New Hampshire Pheasant Stamp contest; first runner-up in both the 1986 Ohio Duck Stamp contest and the 1986 North Carolina Wild Turkey Stamp contest; Painting of the Year, North Carolina Wildlife Federation 1985.

### ABOUT THE PROGRAM:

"Hooded Mergansers" by Durant Ball marks a special edition to the New Hampshire Stamp Print program. For the first time a 24 karat Gold Plated Medallion Edition will be offered. The Gold Medallion Edition will be limited to 500 on a first come, first served basis. Image size for the print is 6½ × 9, sheet size is 12 × 14. Deadline for orders is October 31, 1986. Delivery of the prints will be late fall, 1986.

Robert Steiner has been chosen by the New Hampshire Fish and Game Department as the artist for the 1987 New Hampshire Duck Stamp and print. His highly realistic image of Canada Geese will mark the Fifth Anniversary of New Hampshire Duck Stamp prints. Monies raised through the sale of these stamps and prints will be used by the Department for important wetlands and conservation work.

The regular edition will be strictly limited to the number of orders received by March 1, 1988. This insures that the print will be sold out and on the secondary market as of that date.

There will also be minted for 1987 a special gold medallion to commemorate the Fifth Anniversary of

the New Hampshire Duck Stamp program. These will be available to accompany the regular edition and in a medallion edition of only 50 prints.

### ***Special Governor's Edition***

For the first time in any state, the Governor of New Hampshire, the Honorable John H. Sununu, will sign, along with Mr. Steiner, an extremely limited edition of only 50 of the very finest impressions which will be color remarked and accompanied with a medallion and signed Governor's Edition stamp.

Additionally, for the first time in any state, there will be a Governor's Edition stamp limited to only six hundred stamps. These Governor's Editions mark the beginning of something new.

## About The Print

The 1987 New Hampshire Duck Stamp print will be available in three editions: regular, medallion, and Governor's. Regular edition prints will be limited to the number of orders received by March 1, 1988. All matching numbers will be honored. Any unsold regular edition prints remaining on March 1, 1988 will be destroyed, assuring that the print will be sold out and appreciating on the secondary market as of then. A special Fifth Anniversary gold plated bronze medallion will be available to accompany the regular edition. The matching number to the regular edition print will be stamped on the back of the medallion. Additionally a separate medallion edition of 50 prints with accompanying medallions numbered one through fifty will be available. Pencil and color remarques will be available on either of these editions. There will also be 75 Artist Proofs and 50 Conservation edition prints.

Finally, there will be issued a top of the line edition of 50 Governor's Edition prints. Each will be signed by Governor John H. Sununu, color remarqued and accompanied with a medallion and a hand signed Governor's Edition stamp.

## About The Stamps

New Hampshire is introducing an exciting new concept in Duck Stamp collecting. Along with the regular stamps printed for the hunting license (which will be numbered to 51,000), New Hampshire will be the first state ever to issue a special Governor's Edition of stamps. These will be limited to only 600 stamps printed in 20 sheets of 30 stamps. Each will be clearly marked "Governor's Edition" and will be signed in the plate by Governor Sununu. Of the 600 stamps, only 200 will be hand signed by Governor John H. Sununu.

Any unsold regular edition prints remaining on March 1, 1989 will be destroyed, assuring that the print will be sold out and appreciating on the secondary market as of then.

The top of the line Governor's Edition will be strictly limited to 100 prints, which will be numbered, signed by the artist and Governor John H. Sununu, and accompanied by a matching number, handsigning Governor's Edition stamp. Numbers one through 50 of the Governor's Edition will be color remarked and accompanied by a Governor's Edition medallion, numbers 51 through 75 will be pencil remarked and accompanied by a Governor's Edition medallion, and numbers 76 through 100 will not be remarked but will be accompanied by a Governor's Edition medallion.

A Medallion edition of 50 prints will be available. Each will be signed by the artist only, numbered, and accompanied by a commemorative medallion. Additionally there will be 100 Artist Proofs and 60 Conservation edition prints.

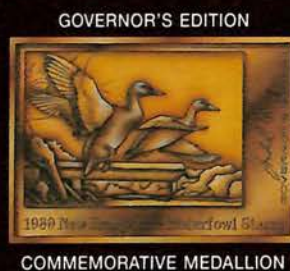

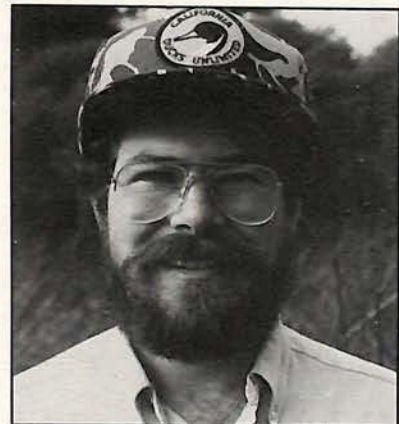

### ABOUT THE ARTIST

Richard Clifton, a 30-year-old Milford, Delaware native, is a self taught artist who specializes in wildlife. Winner of the 1991-92 Idaho Duck Stamp Contest, Richard has also been selected to paint the 1991-92 duck stamp for the State of Tennessee. Recently, Richard won the contest for the 1992 Florida Duck Stamp and, after placing in the top four in the last five years, Richard won the 1992 Delaware duck stamp contest. This was the first time a Delaware artist has won the Delaware duck stamp contest in open competition. After the Delaware win, Richard took top honors in two more state duck stamp competitions. These include wins in the 1992 New Hampshire contest and the 1992 Nevada duck stamp competition. This gives Richard a total of six state duck stamps, four of which are contest wins for the '92-'93 season. Richard's four wins in one season may be a record in duck stamp competition. In addition to his duck stamp wins, Richard won the 1992 New York Ducks Unlimited artist of the year competition.
