As petitions for this appropriation are proceeding from all parts of the country at the present time, I would suggest that yours may be forwarded at the earliest moment. In case of an appropriation being made, the expenses paid by you will be refunded.

The United States goods were shipped from London, on board the "Caroline Read," on the 15th ultimo, and may be expected to arrive here on or about the 20th inst. Begging your instructions in reference to your goods, I have the honor to be,
