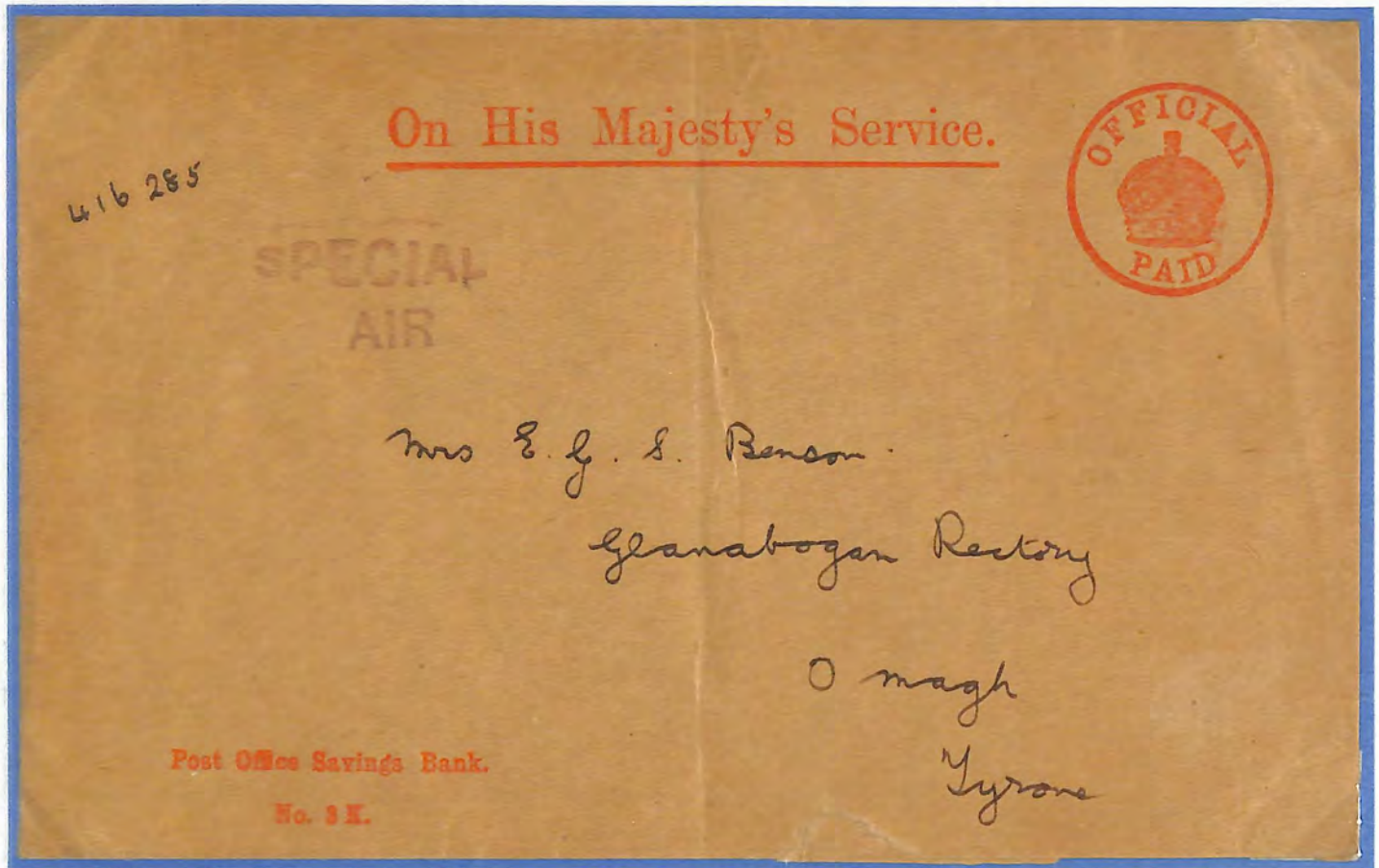


Special War Loan

At the time of the flight from London to Dublin piloted by Captain Waters in the D.H.42 "Helena" G-AAXF was the largest aircraft to have landed at Baldonnell airport. Despite the huge quantity of mail that was carried these envelopes are rarely seen especially those originating from the Post Office Savings Bank.

Due to the large amount of mail, some 50,000 envelopes all of which needed to reach their destination at the same time resulted in the airliner 'Helena' being chartered from Imperial airways to carry the mail to Baldonnel (Dublin).
