IT WAS ISSUED ON THE 125th ANNIVERSARY OF THE SS SAVANNAH'S SAILING FROM SAVANNAH, GA. FOR LIVERPOOL, ENGLAND--THE FIRST TRANSATLANTIC CROSSING BY A STEAMSHIP--ON MAY 22, 1819. STEAMSHIPS STAMP

ISSUED
MAY 22, 1944

The S. S. Savannah, built in New York by Francis Fickett in 1818 as a sailing packet, had auxiliary engine and boiler with paddlewheels fitted before she was placed in service. Owned by Savannah, Georgia, men, in May, 1819, she left for Liverpool, England, reaching port in 27 days, 80 hours of which she operated by steam.

September 29, she started on return to United States via St. Petersburg, Stockholm and other Baltic ports, arriving in Savannah, Georgia, November 30, 1819.

The leviathan Steamships and Battleships of today are a far cry in size and power from the little ship that made the first trans-Atlantic trip.

The first American ship to use steam in crossing an ocean was the Savannah, 350 tons, built in New York City by Francis Ficket and engined by Stephen Vail. She left Savannah, Ga., on May 22, 1819, and reached Liverpool in 26 days, during 18 of which she used her side paddles. The steamer went thence to Stockholm and St. Petersburg; left St. Petersburg October 10, arrived at Savannah, November 30. Her Captain was Moses Rogers of Georgetown, N. C. The Savannah, divested of the engine sank off the Long Island, N. Y. coast. The engine was for a time in a London museum. The Savannah was a sailing vessel but used steam only as auxiliary power. The log of her 1819 voyage is owned by the U. S. National Museum, in Washington, D. C.
