RATE MARKINGS

In the early period of Spanish postal service, the postage was paid upon arrival. The amount to be paid was in manuscript on the front of the letter. About 1745, stamped rate markings appear. These indicate the postal fee due in Maravidis (MS.) or Reales (RS.). The colors of these markings are black, red, blue and sometimes greens. The actual numbers range from "l" to "12". According to most authorities, "O" indicated an early version of certified or registered service.

Letters, such as "A" or "R", also appear on prestamp covers. There meaning is often debated among postal historians. However, most seem to have a relationship to the postal service the letter received before or after it departed from the original post office. And, some "letters" are foreign postal markings such as "PP" a French mark indicating postage paid.



ORNAMENTAL AND DATED PRIMITIVOS

Apparently most town and provincial post offices were content with simple straightlines. Many continued in use for over 100 years, even used as cancellations in the stamp era. For some provinces and cities, however, simple straightlines were not enough.

Beginning about 1725, postal markings with decorations and dates begin to appear. Madrid, the Royal capital, began to use a simple "M", topped by a crown and later added the date posted. Boxes, ovals and symbolic figures adorn the markings of other provinces and towns.
