The Court aforesaid, doth therefore by these presents, ordain, constitute and appoint you administrat^{or} of all and singular the goods, chattels, rights, credits and estate aforesaid, and doth hereby grant unto you full power and authority to administer all and singular the goods, chattels, rights, credits and estate of the said deceased, which to him while he lived, and at the time of his death did appertain, and the same well and faithfully to dispose of, according to law; also to demand, collect, recover and receive all and singular the rights and credits of the said deceased, and pay all debts in which he stood bound, so far as the goods, chattels, rights, credits and estate aforesaid, under the orders of said Court, will enable you to do. And having accepted the said trust, and given bonds conditioned for the faithful performance of the duties thereof, in the form prescribed by law, you will make or cause to be made, a true and perfect inventory of all the goods, chattels, rights, credits and estate of the said deceased, and the same return, or cause to be returned, to the Register of the Probate Court for the District aforesaid, on or before the *seventh* day of *February* next ensuing, and also return to the said Register, a true and just account of your administration in the premises, on or before the *seventh* day of *November* Anno Domini, 183 *6*

Dear Sir

Yours of the 26th reached me this day. I do not recollect any thing in your letter of the 7th March important except that probably it was a letter of that date that brought me two notes of Mounty & Nicutzell. Upon search I can find no letter from you of that date.

As to the two notes of Mounty & Nicutzell after having made several unsuccessful attempts to coax Mounty out of the money or a part of it I bro'ought sent upon them. He pretended to be mixed with you and his partner Nicutzell who he says set you on him and therefore would not pay.

You some time asked me if I knew such a man as Geo. Sibbald. I do he resides in Georgia. He married a girl in this Town and is sometimes here he has not however been this place since about the 1st of July last.

Inclosed I send you a post note for \$600 on acct of your claim ag^t. Tho' I see be so good as to acknowledge the receipt of it. I fear you will not finger the balance of that money till about the middle of July next.

Mason, John Thomson.—Born at Montpelier, Washington County, Maryland, in May, 1815; graduated at Princeton College in 1836; read law in Hagerstown, and was admitted to the bar in 1838; the same year was elected a member of the Legislature of Maryland, and re-elected in 1839. He was a Representative in Congress from 1841 to 1843, being at that time the youngest man in Congress. In 1851 he was elected by the people, under the new Constitution of the State, a Judge of the Court of Appeals, which position he filled till 1857, when he resigned, and was appointed Collector
