





The reverse shows the transit pmks. of Port Taufia R2 and Port Said R with a faint arrival pmk. dated Jan. 16, 1920.





In transit postmarks include Cairo receival 2 May 15, Cairo dispatched 3 May 15, Heliopolis arrival 3 May 15, and arrival at British Camp PO on 3 May 15. The last strike is the rare wide "P.O." variety.


