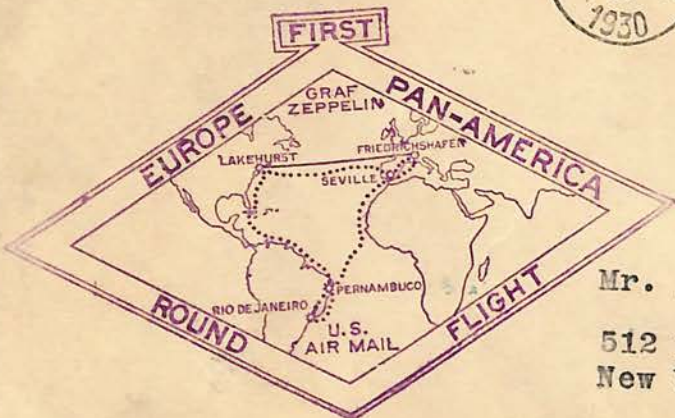

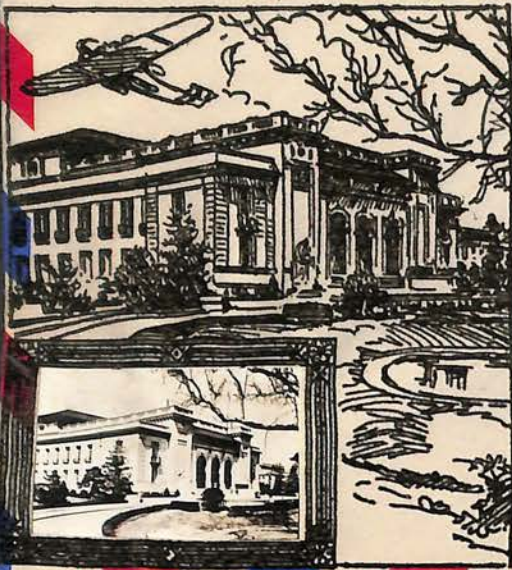

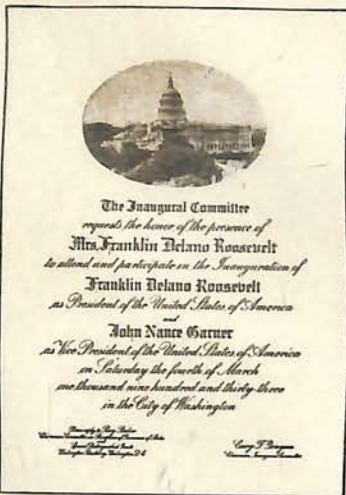

Roosevelt made his acceptance speech by radio, talking to the Convention from his train in San Diego.

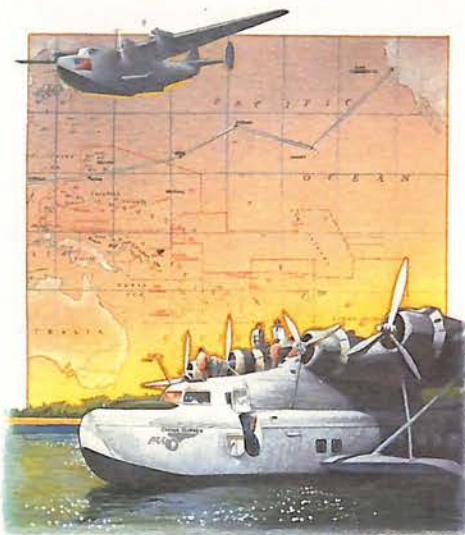
