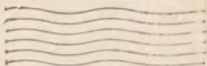

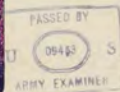

V-Mail Service provides the most expeditious dispatch and reduces the weight of mail to and from personnel of our Armed Forces outside the continental United States. When addressed to points where micro-film equipment is operated, a miniature photographic negative of the message will be made and sent by the most expeditious transportation available for reproduction and delivery. The original message will be destroyed after the reproduction has been delivered. Messages addressed to or from points where micro-film equipment is not operated will be transmitted in their original form by the most expeditious means available.

- (1) Write the entire message plainly on the other side within marginal lines.
- (2) PRINT the name and address in the two panels provided. Address to members of the Armed Forces should include rank or rating of the addressee, unit to which attached, and APO or Naval address.
- (3) Fold, seal, and deposit in any post office letter drop or street letter box.

WHAT TO DO

- ★ Use only the official "V Mail" Letter Sheet. You won't get the service by marking your regular mail "V Mail."
- ★ Seal and address "V Mail" Letter Sheet as you do your regular mail.
- ★ Use the same amount of postage as on regular domestic mail. (3c ordinary mail, 6c air mail).
- ★ Use any mail box or post office.

WHAT HAPPENS

- ★ Special preference is given "V Mail" over all other classes of overseas mail.
- ★ "V Mail" is photographed at government expense.
- ★ "V Mail" Microfilm goes by the fastest available means of transportation.
- ★ "V Mail" is delivered in much less time than usually required for regular mail delivery.

When addressed to points where micro-film equipment is operated, a miniature photographic negative of the message will be made and sent by the most expeditious transportation available for reproduction and delivery. The original message will be destroyed after the reproduction has been made and the equipment is ready for use. Messages addressed to or from points where micro-film equipment is not operated will be transmitted in their original form by the most expeditious means available.

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- (3) Fold, seal, and deposit in any post office letter drop or street letter box.
- (4) Enclosures must not be placed in this envelope and a separate V-Mail letter must be sent if you desire to write more than one sheet.
- (5) V-Mail letters may be sent free of postage by members of the Armed Forces. When sent by others postage must be prepaid at domestic rates (3c ordinary mail, 6c if air mail is desired).

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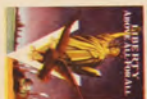
