H.K. Shigley (1897-1992)

Harold K. Shigley was born on July 4, 1897 in Logan County, Ohio, the youngest son of Alonzo Shigley and Frances (Berger) Shigley. His grandfather, Lewis Hiram Shigley, had been a decorated veteran of the Civil War, while his great grandfather, Frederick Shigley, was one of the first pioneers to settle in what is now Western Ohio, owning the area's largest shoe manufacturing and repair business, and possessing much of the land stretching along the Indiana border in present day Auglaize County.

After graduating from high school two years early, at the age of 16, Harold enrolled at Ohio State University, where he majored in history, eventually receiving his doctorate at the young age of 23. After college, Shigley taught part-time and operated a loan company out of his home in Columbus, Ohio. He soon tired of this and left the operation of the loan business to his wife Dorothy, while he became somewhat of a wanderer, taking excursions to nearly every corner of the globe on a quest for relics. During the next seven decades, he spent much of his time traveling, collecting many one-of-a-kind items. His obsession with collecting was responsible for the accumulation of what was probably the world's largest collection of unique historical artifacts belonging to famous personages.

His health began to decline after returning from his last trip to the Holy Land in late 1990. He passed away from pneumonia on December 31, 1992 at the age of 95.
