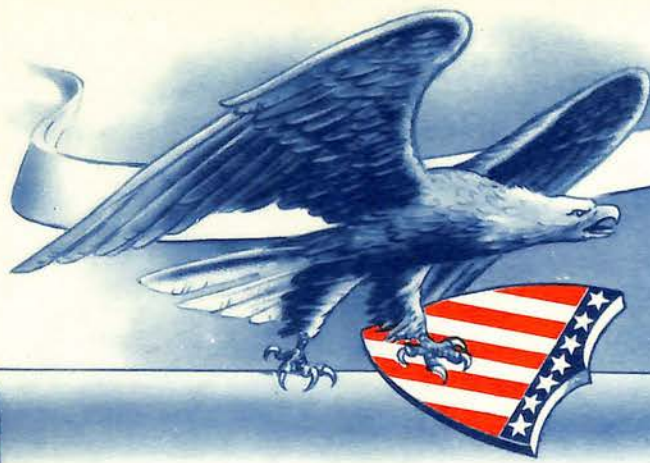
Fast Ocean Navigation

Coinciding with the opening and closing of the Pan American Exposition at Buffalo, N. Y., this set was placed on sale May 1, 1901, at Post Offices throughout the country and withdrawn from sale October 31, 1901. The stamps were issued to commemorate and publicize the exposition which had for its theme, "To illustrate the progress of the New World during the 19th Century." Pictures on the stamps are reproductions from current means of transportation.

They were also intended to advertise the Panama Pacific Exposition. Due to the adoption of the 10 gauge late in 1914, the stamps were re-issued in 1915 perforated 10.

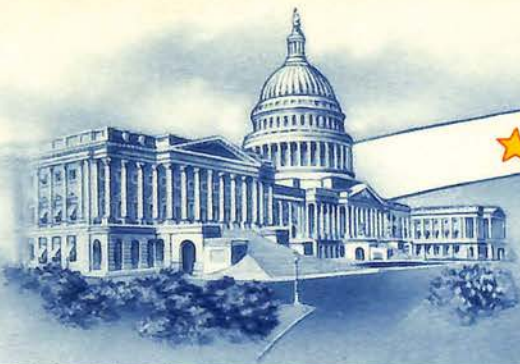

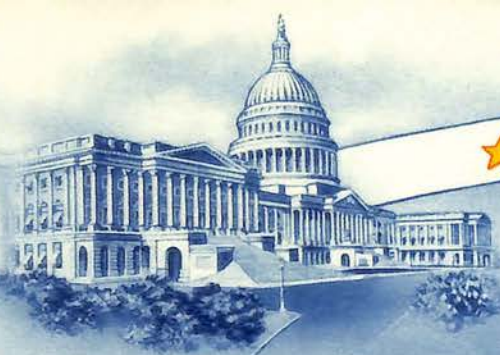

The Kansas and Nebraska issues of overprinted stamps were authorized as a measure of preventing losses from post office burglaries. Approximately a year's supply of the stamps were printed and issued to postmasters in the respective States. Post Office Department found it desirable to discontinue the State overprinted stamps after the initial supply was used.

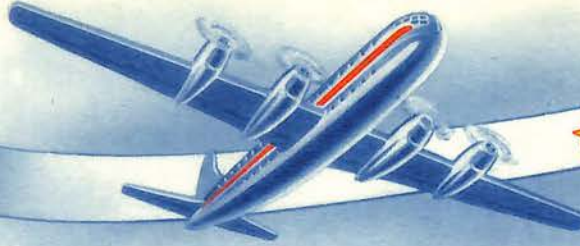

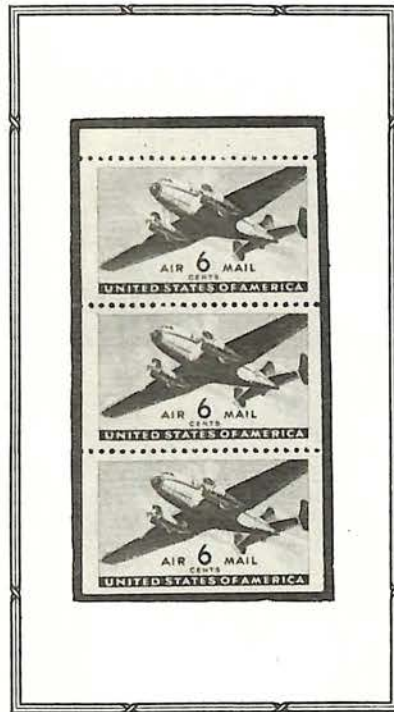

The 10c Lindbergh stamps were issued in booklet form to popularize the air mail service. There were two panes to a booklet which sold for sixty-one cents.

Twin-Motor Mail Transport

The 6c air mail stamp of the 1941 series was issued March 18, 1943 in booklet pane form. It was primarily for use by the armed forces. First issued with four panes to the booklet at seventy-three cents, later in two pane booklets at thirty-seven cents.
