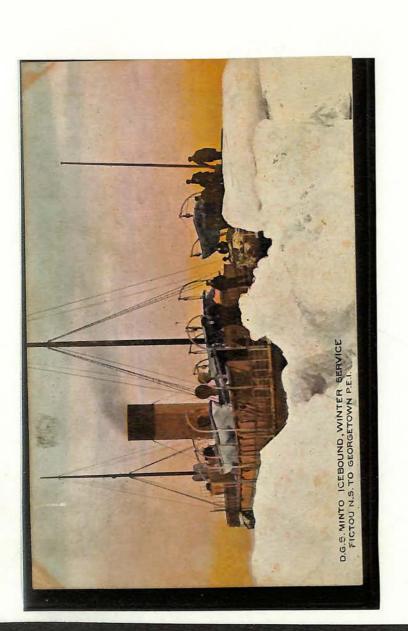
MOVING THE MAIL OF PRINCE EDWARD ISLAND ON TRAINS AND BOATS FROM 1877 TO 1968

The purpose of this exhibit is to help the "average" collector understand how mail from 1877 thru 1968 moved about the Island on trains and off the Island on boats, ferries and ice boats. Railway and ship cancels and markings along with a few rare clerk's cachets that were used on everyday mail are shown.

The railway mail clerks used canceling devices identifying which rail line the train was on when the mail was canceled. The clerks would cancel and sort mail on special mail cars attached to the trains. These cancels were often placed on the back of envelopes. When this occurs the front will also be shown at a reduced size (25%). Often the cancels are hard to read because of under-inking or being placed over stamps. When this happens enlarged copies of the date stamps may be used to improve readability of these cancels.

The cancels changed over the years, some lasting only weeks and some lasting over 25 years. Sometimes the only difference in cancels are the diameter of the circle (a few millimeters larger), a missing period, comma or the use of a square dot. The markings are assigned a MA or RR reference number taken from Lewis Ludlow's "Catalogue of Canadian Railway Cancellations" 1982. In 2009 Ross Gray wrote a new "Canadian Railway Post Office Cancellation" book and all the numbers and rarity factors have been changed. These elaborate classification numbers, although very useful to the specialist are meaningless to the general reader of this exhibit and are not used as they would complicate the write-ups.

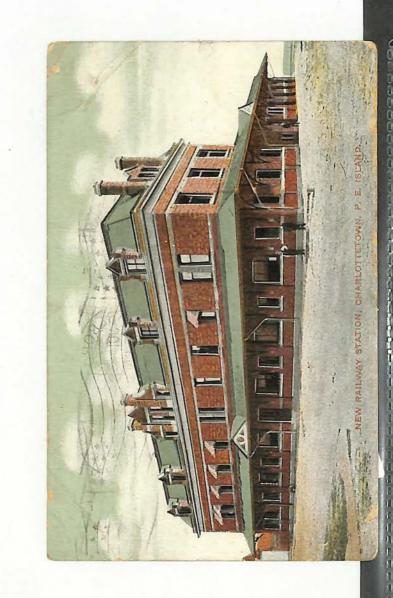

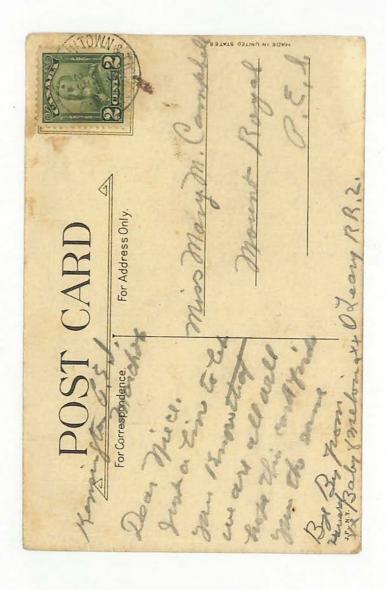

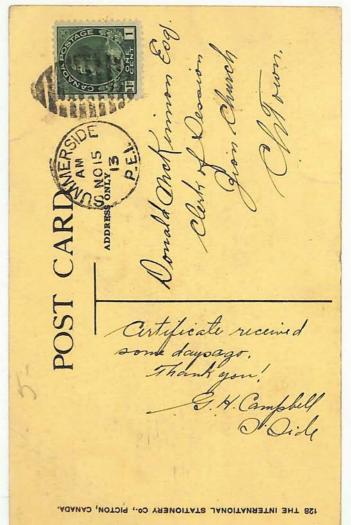

THE MURRAY HARBOUR BRANCH LINE

The Murray Harbour branch line was opened in 1905 and the construction necessitated a bridge over the Hillsborough River:

The original railway surveyors had considered a bridge over the Hillsborough river in 1871 but decided to avoid such a lengthy span by diverting the line to Mount Stewart. Work started on the bridge in 1901 and it was completed in 1905:

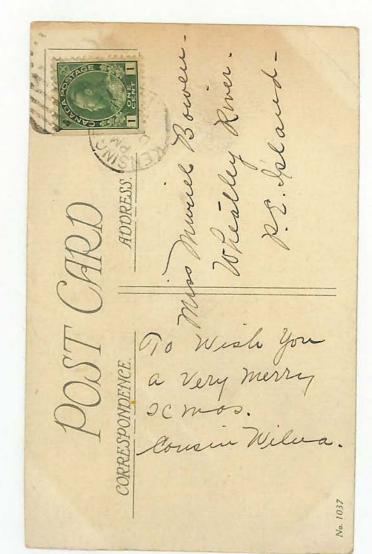

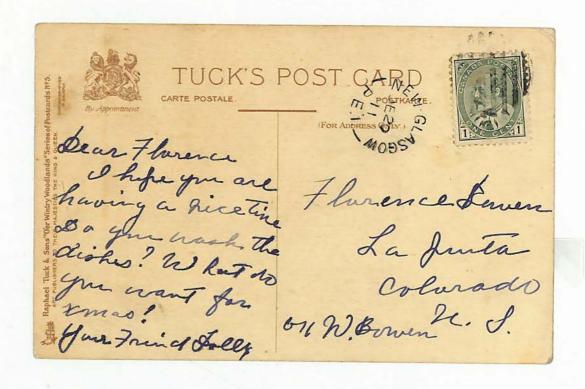


Edwardian postcard with narrow gauge locomotive in Murray Harbour station

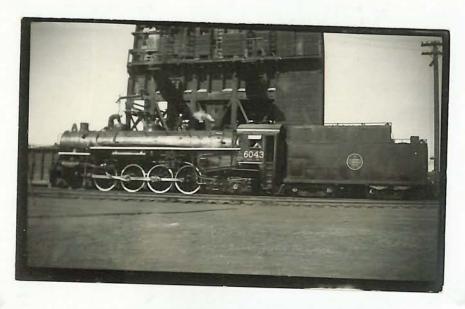

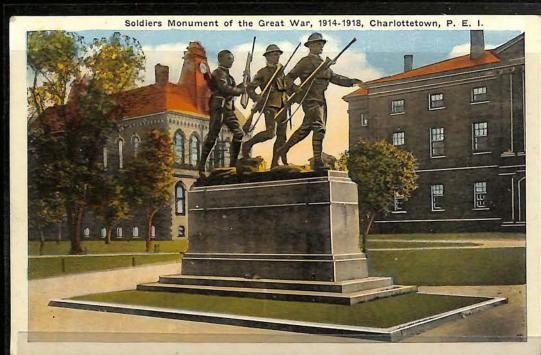

GENERAL INFORMATION

The adjacent map shows the network of the Prince Edward Railway around 1900 before the addition of the Murray Harbour branch line and the extensions to Montague and Elmira. It also clearly shows the mail/passenger ferry connections to the Island. These consisted of Summerside to Point du Chene, Charlottetown to Pictou and Georgetown to Pictou.

In addition the map shows the mail route via ice boats in winter from Cape Traverse to Cape Tormentine (when the Island was totally ice-bound the ice boats were the only way to get mail to And from the Island).

Once on the Island the mail was conveyed via the Prince Edward Island Railway on routes as shown on the map. An important extension was added in 1905 in the form of the Murray Harbour branch line, with its subsequent spur to Montague in 1906.

Charlottetown was at the center of the system and from there lines went west to Summerside &Alberton (subsequently to Tignish) with a spur down to Cape Traverse in 1885 so the trains could connect with the ice boats. In 1917 the latter extension was modified to run from Borden when the year-round ice-breaking ferry the "Prince Edward Island" was introduced.

The railway also ran east from Charlottetown to Souris and Georgetown, and eventually to Murray Harbour as mentioned.
