


This is a most interesting short paid cover to Glasgow, Scotland. The cover was mailed from Charleston, S.C. on February 9, 1912 via New York. The proper rate from the United States to Scotland at the time was five cents per ounce plus the Registration rate of ten cents so the letter was short paid three cents. It was received in Scotland on February 20th and marked with a blue "T" signifying postage due. It is marked "6" in manuscript on the reverse, double the three cents deficiency, which was to be collected at the destination.






Massillon, Ohio to Paris France, March 9, 1912. Note the Paris mail cancel on the reverse. The trip took ten days via New York.





Covers addressed to foreign countries are not readily found. Illustrated is a cover retrieved from Haynau (Schlesien), Germany. It was sent from Hoboken, New Jersey to Germany, via England on September 26, 1912.

The 10¢ Registry Stamp used on a 5¢ stamped envelope of the 1903 series to Naples, Italy, December 14, 1915. Note the red circular backstamp (below) reading "Raccomandate (B) Napoli" indicating receipt by the Registry Section of the Naples post office. The receiving date is smudged. Note also the directions for "excelsior" a product used in the treatment of tooth decay.
