"Light Sky" Variety of the PHEASANT Booklet Stamps

1988

The "Ring-necked Pheasant" booklet was the first one made by a security printer other than the BEP, viz: the ABNC (American Bank Note Company).

The stamps were released April 29, 1988, with the sky being a blend of blue and red photogravure color dots, resulting in a somewhat deep blue sky (Plates A 1111). The USPS suggested that, when printing further batches, ABNC rather "back off a little on the blue". ABNC followed suit and entirely eliminated the red in the sky of the stamp.

That created the "Light Sky" variety (Plates A 3111 & A 3222), with October 31, 1988, as the earliest known date of use.






