




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



Mail Plane

The first air-mail flight to take place in the United States occured Sept . 23, 1911 on a route from Garden City Estates, L. I., N. Y. to Mineola, N. Y. This was the forerunner of many similar short or local flights by barnstorming pilots in different parts of the Country with approval of the Post Office Department. An Act of Congress in May 1918 definitely placed mail carrying by plane on a recognized basis with the rate set at 24¢. On May 13, 1918, the first air-mail stamp of 24¢ denomination in carmine and blue made its appearance in connection with the inauguration of air service from New York to Washington. The famous inverted error appeared in this issue. Subsequent reductions in the Air Mail rates resulted in the 16¢ green being issued July 11, 1918 and the 6¢ orange Dec. 10th of the same year.

Mail Plane

Issued primarily for use in the new night flying service between New York and San Francisco, this issue of three stamps was placed on sale at Washington, D. C. August 15, 1923 for the 8¢ denomination, August 17th for the 16¢, and August 21st for the 24¢. The rate was on a three zone basis at 8¢ per ounce per zone, with each zone approximately 1,000 miles in length across the continent.





Early Mail Plane



Early Mail Plane

In May 1918, an Act of Congress placed mail carrying by plane on an officially scheduled basis with the postage rate set at 24c. The first air mail stamp was released on May 13, 1918 in connection with the inauguration of air mail service from New York to Washington, D.C. The denomination was 24c and it was this stamp that created the famous inverted airplane error. The 16c denomination was first placed on sale July 11th followed by the 6c on December 10th.

Early Biblane

Released primarily for use in the new night flying service between New York and San Francisco, the 1923 air mails were placed on sale in Washington during August, The 8c denomination on the 15th, the 16c on the 17th and the 24c on the 21st. New reduced rates were put into effect on a three-zone basis at 8c per ounce per zone, with each zone approximately 1,000 miles in length across the country.

General acceptance of this faster method of mail service resulted in a heavy demand for air mail stamps. This caused the discontinuance of the more cumbersome bicolor issue in favor of the speedier printed one color design. The issues above picture the insignia of an air mail pilot. The 5c violet appeared flat plate process perforation 11 on February 10, 1930 and by rotary press perforation $10\frac{1}{2} \times 11$ on August 19, 1931. The same design was issued in an 8c olive green color on September 26, 1932 to conform with the new air rate. The 6c orange, also for a rate change, appeared July 1, 1934. Both these values were produced by rotary press, perforation $10\frac{1}{2} \times 11$.
