Kenya "Specimen" Stamps Found Used for Air and Registered Mail

FROM B. Wischnia, 13 Mill View Road, Yapton, Nr. Arundel, Sussex, England, we have the information that several hundred Kenya stamps, all with "Specimen" overprint, have been found recently, most of them having been used on air mail and registered letters.

Mr. Wischnia advises that these stamps with specimen overprints had up to then not been known. After some investigation and correspondence with the postal authorities in Nairobi, Kenya, he adds, it has been officially confirmed that the stamps had been prepared for the Administration and trained staff of the Kenya Postal Administration; however, their use was not officially allowed and had been used for postage "by some unscrupulous members of the Postal Administration." None of the stamps is available from the Postal Authorities in Kenya.

The type of overprint: Large and small, in red, black, violet, and blue, on the 1954 issue, all values to 5/-, and on the 1960 issue, all values to the £1.

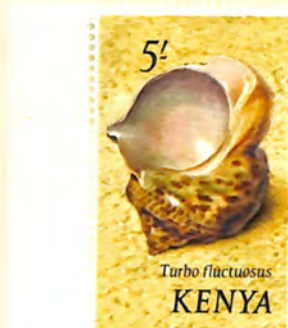

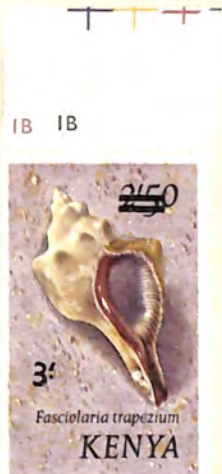

Short Supply Provisionals

A disturbing report has just been received from a correspondent in Limuru, Kenya, who refers to some unheralded surcharges which have not been on general sale.

This issue consists of surcharges on the current definitives as follow: Kenya and Uganda—2/- on 1/50; 3/- on 2/50; and 40/- on 20/-. Tanzania—as Kenya and Uganda with the addition of an 80c. on 60c. stamp. The Uganda stamps were issued on September 29th and the others on November 17th.

Our correspondent reports that the stamps were not available over post office counters and were only available from the stamp bureaux for personal callers. The Nairobi stamp bureau was sold out of the Kenya and Tanzania issue on the morning of November 17th.

As far as can be ascertained, the only advance warning of this issue was an announcement in the local press stating that it would be a "limited" issue and that no advance orders would be taken. Holders of deposit accounts with the stamp bureaux do not seem to have been circulated with advance warning of the issue and are not known to have received any of the stamps.

Whilst there is a valid reason for issuing stamps of these denominations, due to recent rises in postage rates, the fact that they were not available at post offices seems to indicate that they were not issued for postal purposes. This is especially true for Uganda as, on October 9th, a complete new Uganda definitive set (including the above values) was issued.

In the light of the above, collectors may feel that this issue cannot be regarded as an issue of "postage" stamps. Our informant comments that East Africa has a good reputation with regard to its stamp-issuing policy and it is a pity that this reputation should be sullied by issues of this nature.

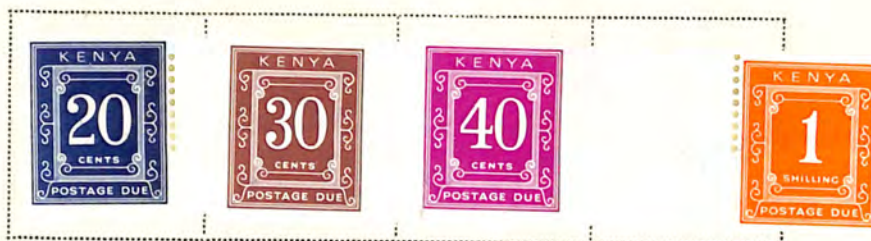

Southern Cameroons, 1d., 2d., 6d. De La Rue printing from Waterlow plates. The 1d. appears to have been printed from the original (Nigeria) plate, and not from the "rotary" as used for the overprinted stamp released October 1st, 1960 (CW.43a). The 2d. has been redrawn in parts, particularly the shading of the clouds and background hills. The 6d. is a new perforation $13 \times 13\frac{1}{2}$ (C). All three values are worth listing.

Kenya, Uganda, Tanganyika, 5c., 10c., 15c., 20c., 30c., 40c., 50c., 5/-. The shade of the 10c. is very similar to the coil, being in a lighter green than the original release in sheets. The 25c. is also in a paler bronze green. As for the printings in general, some at least appear to have come from plates where the screens are finer than was the case originally. This is particularly noticeable with the 40c.

Two major retouches have been submitted to me by Mr. M. W. Muscott, of Godalming, Surrey, on the 10 cent, S.G. 109, plate 1B, of the Independence issue. They occur on row 10, nos. 9 and 10, where the amount of retouching is almost impossible to describe, for practically all of the lighter screening dots in the bottom half of both subjects have been re-entered. The background behind the word TANGANYIKA now consists of a blurred mass of dots, especially on no. 10, whilst the shading on the nurse's uniform at the right-hand edge of stamps has also been completely re-entered. On no. 9 this shading is almost the correct shape, but on no. 10 it has a half-moon shaped cut in it when compared with a normal stamp. The background in the area of the value also appears to have been touched up on these two subjects, as well as some others in the lower right-hand corner of the sheet (J).

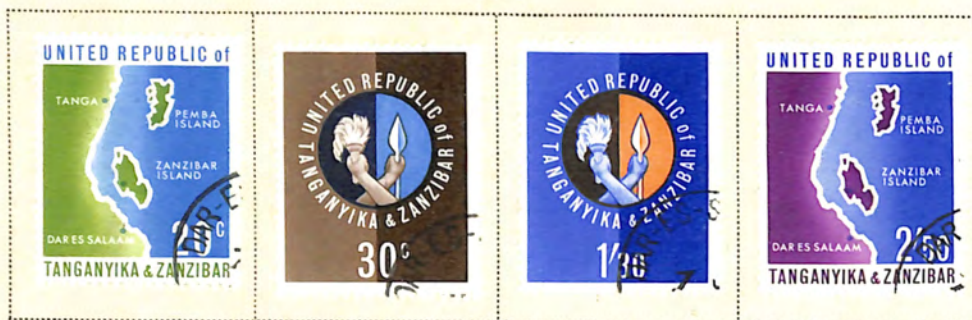

As for matching of the colours, most of the latest differ slightly from the printing replaced, but with the possible exception of the 1s., which is considerably paler in colour than the last printing, and the 1s.50, which has a paler background (which will be listed in any event, on grounds of being on glazed paper), no notice is likely to be taken of what colour changes there are.
