




The New York City Postmaster's Provisional 150th Anniversary 1845-1995

Robert Hunter Morris became the Postmaster of New York City on May 21, 1845. Shortly after his appointment, he contracted with an American Bank Note Company predecessor, the New York engraving firm of Rawdon, Wright & Hatch, to produce an adhesive stamp for mail arriving and departing from New York City.

This stamp is, in many respects, America's first postage stamp. Although other provisionals predate Morris' adhesive, the New York provisional was the first to be recognized as prepayment on incoming mail to New York City, and the first to see widespread use on both domestic and foreign mail.

Morris' New York City "experiment" was watched closely by federal officials and its success led to the passage of *The Act of March 3, 1847*, authorizing the Postmaster General of the United States to issue this country's very first postage stamps.

Shown at the right is an impression of a die only recently discovered in the American Bank Note Company steel archives. This particular die, created from the original, was most likely used to produce salesmen's samples or gifts during the 1860's through the 1880's. Proofs of this die are known to collectors in black, brown, blue, green, scarlet, and gray.



PROGRESSIVE PROOF CERTIFICATION

This Souvenir Card, Progressive Proof Set, is only one of ten such sets designed by Souvenir Card Collector Society member Rich Brinton, and printed by Bureau of Engraving and Printing Plate Printer Mike Bean. It was produced in 1996 on the occasion of the 120th Anniversary of the United States 1876 Centennial International Exhibition, held in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania,

Progressive Proof Sets serve as an educational reference and are relatively scarce in the collector market. Each set contains eight individual cards. demonstrating the different phases of production, and required the use of six separate steel dies to achieve production of the finished Souvenir Card. The completed Souvenir Card in all ten Progressive Proof Sets bears the Limited Edition #000 printed in red.

The eight separate printing operations are as follows:

Black -1st Pass - Borders, Heading & Text -Offset. 2nd Pass - Centennial Heading Text Black -Offset. 3rd Pass - Philadelphia Black -Intaglio 4th Pass - Pennsylvania - Black - Intaglio 5th Pass - Liberty Bell Vignette - Brown - Intaglio 6th Pass - Eagle Vignette - Brown -Intaglio 7th Pass - Centennial Ticket Green -Intaglio 8th Pass - Limited Edition Number Red Letter Press

Each Progressive Proof Set is accompanied by a copy of this certificate which is distinctively numbered #0001 - #0010 in blue, designating it as only one of ten such certificates issued.

Your contribution in the preservation of the original 1876 Centennial International Exhibition steel die, used in the production of these Souvenir Cards, is gratefully acknowledged with the issuance of this Limited Edition Progressive Proof Set.
