WITH THE RARIETY OF THIS SCAMP GENUINELY USED
(THE TWO CENT SCAMP WAS USED TO MEET THE CONFIDENTIAL
DROP RATE (INTRA-CITY MAIL JUST DROPPED AT THE CITY POST
OFFICE - NOT NEEDING ANY TRANSPORT), OPEN CIRCULAR RATE &
FIVE COULD BE USED TO PAY THE TEN CENT GENERAL
POSTAGE RATE) - MANY SINGLE SCAMPS HAVE HAD
FAKE CANCELS ADDED IN AN ATTEMPT TO INFLATE
THEIR VALUE. WHILE THESE ARE COMMON - FAKE
CANCELS ON LARGE STRIPS OR BLOCKS ARE VERY
RARE. THIS STRIP OF FIVE - MIND YOU THE SCAMPS
ARE REAL & QUITE NICE THUS THIS IS SOMEWHAT
EXPENSIVE TO FAKE - IS SO RARE AND SO
NOTORIOUS IT IS ILLUSTRATED IN BRIAN GREEN'S
BOOK ON THE "RED JACK" ON PAGE 46.

A pair of Red Jacks with a fraudulent Yorkville, South Carolina, postmark on a cover with manuscript "Official Business" is shown in Figure 74. Figure 75 depicts a horizontal strip of five of the stamps with fraudulent Fincastle, Virginia, postmarks. The cover is addressed to Captain Jared A.R. Hanks of Georgia whose correspondence became a frequent victim of the faker's art. A good background article on this subject can be found in the July—August 1972 issue of "The Confederate Philatelist".

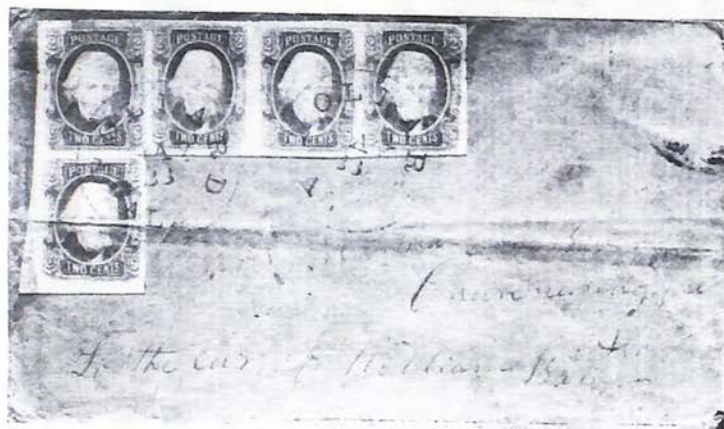

An irregular strip of five which has been planted on a cover, with its original stamp removed from the upper right corner, and struck with fraudulent Pollard, Alabama, cancellations is illustrated in Figure 76.
