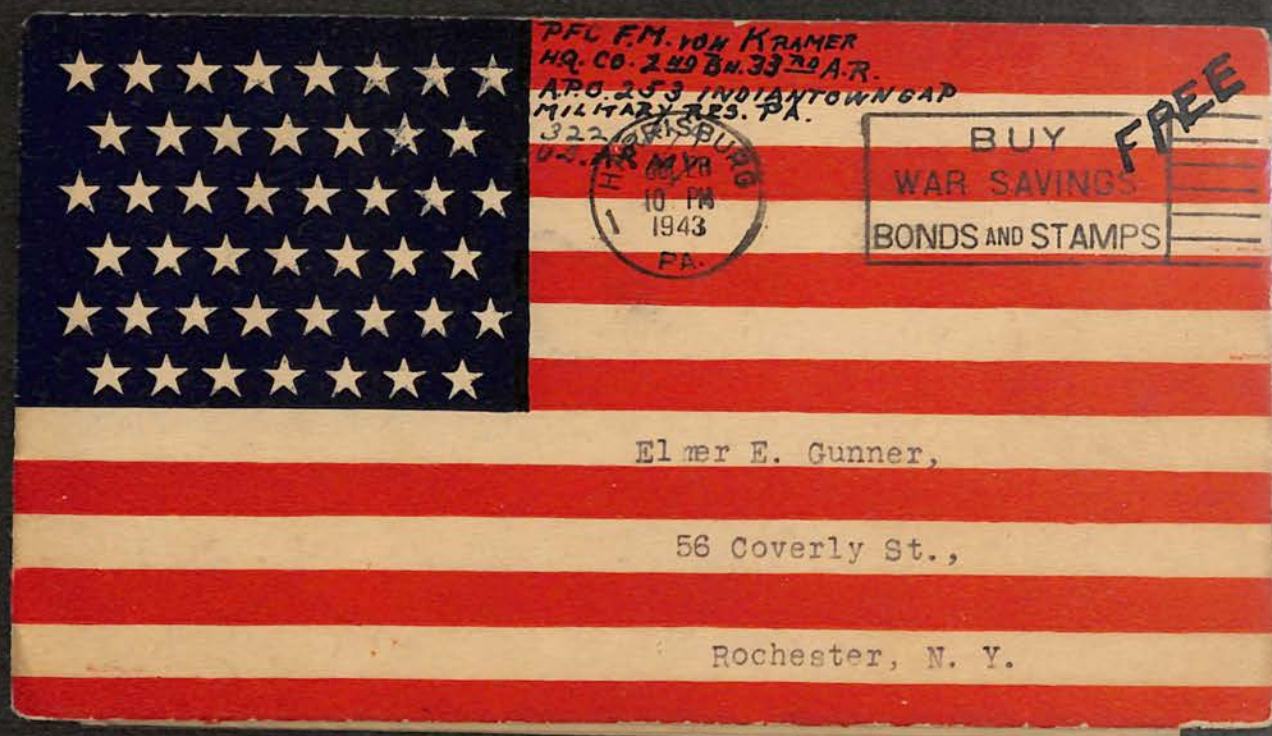

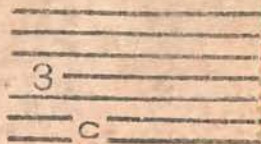

"G" written in 2nd line, on face at TL of cvr w/Jan. 26, 1899 dated AUGUSTA, GA. duplex tying 2c Washington. Incl. original 4pg soldier's letter enclosure, from Harry S. Halford to "Bessie" in Middletown, Pa. Letter incl: "I have been sick with Malaria Fever, and the Surgeon would not let me write...we have a fine camp here and it is all white sand. It is much healthier than 'Camp Meade' was...it is dull here...nothing but niggers. We have the new rifle, the Krag-Jorgenson. They are an awful weapon. They have a knife bayonet attached. I think we are going to Manila soon. I hope so, as I am very anxious to go somewhere. It is awful dull here in Georgia..." cvr slightly reduced at R, just nicking the LR corner of the stamp.
