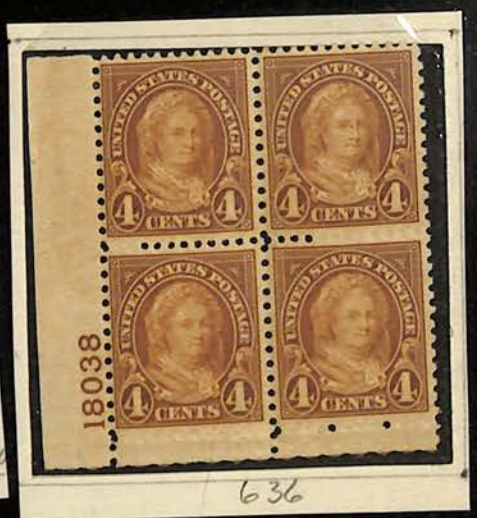


"Victory" and Flags of the Allies

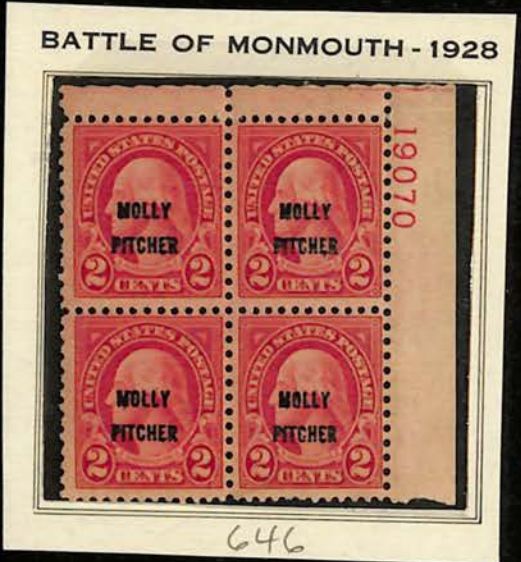

A1-A3 Curtiss Biplane

On May 15, 1918 Air-mail service was established between Washington, Philadelphia and New York and it was during this year that the United States issued its first air mail stamps. The 24¢ denomination was specifically issued to meet the requirements of the new route and the other denominations were created as the rates were reduced. One sheet of the 24¢ stamp was found with the picture of the airplane inverted.

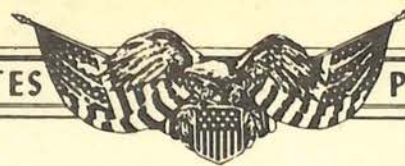
The wonderful development of the United States Air Mail System can be told through its stamp issues. An example of this is the special 10¢ stamp issued as a tribute to the non-stop New York to Paris flight by Charles A. Lindbergh, which paved the way for world-wide air mail coverage.
