Formerly a Spanish possession, Guam was ceded to the United States in 1898 following the Spanish American War. Stamps overprinted "Guam" were superseded by the regular postage stamps of the United States in 1901.

CAP. TAL. Honolulu

Until 1893 an independent kingdom, from 1893 to 1898 a republic, the Hawaiian Islands were annexed to the US in 1898. The Territory of Hawaii achieved statehood in 1959.

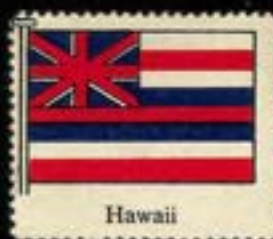

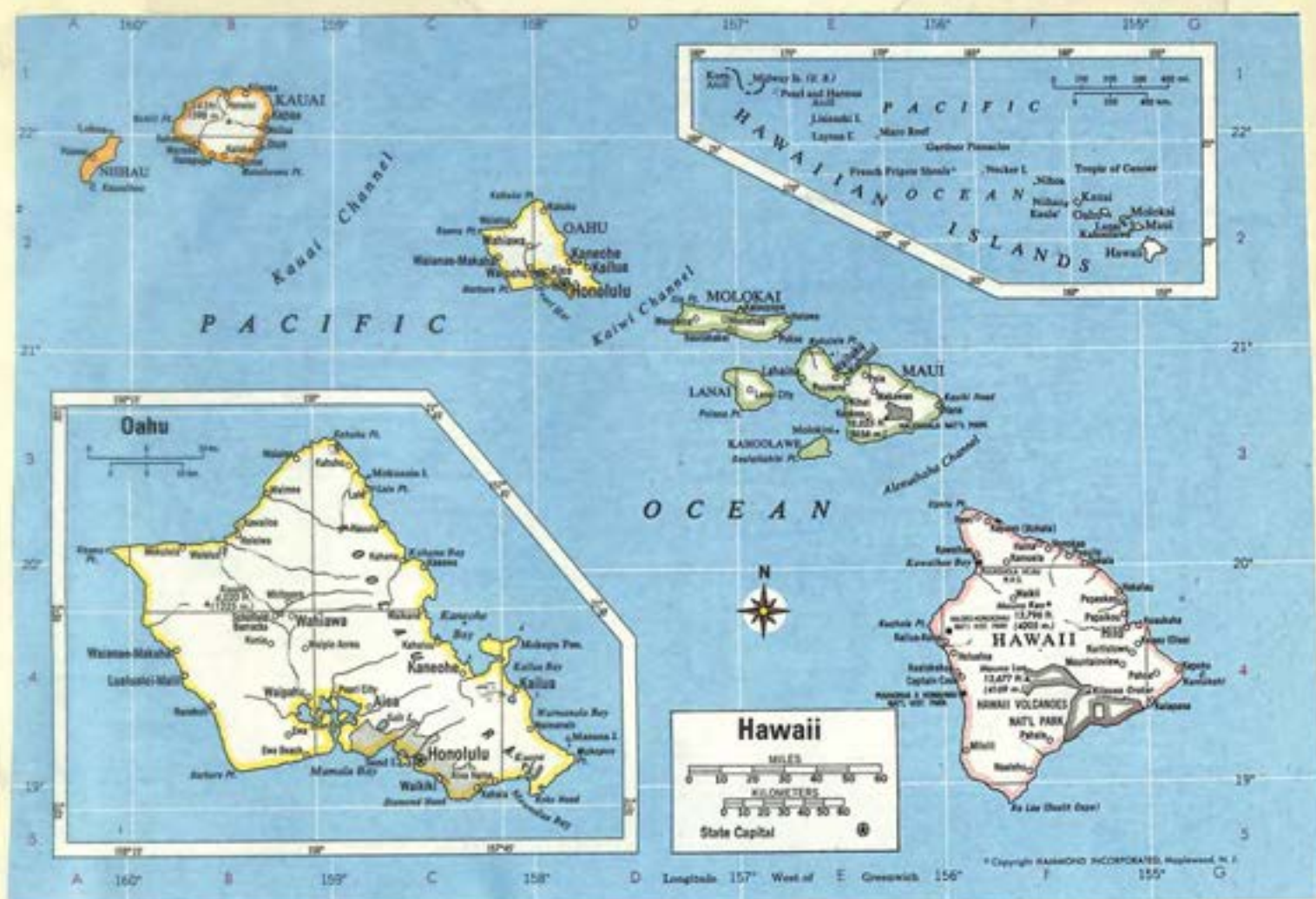

The first four stamps issued by the kingdom of Hawaii, Scott 1-4. Each of these stamps is pictured on the new Hawaiian Missionaries souvenir sheet shown on page 1. These stamps are remarkable for their overall condition and freshness.

The "Hawaiian Missionary" Stamps of 1851-1853



The first official Hawaiian post office was established in December 1850. Postmaster Henry M. Whitney had stamps printed locally in three denominations. Philatelists call these rare stamps "Hawaiian Missionaries" because virtually all were used by Christian missionaries on outbound mail. Only 28 covers with Missionary stamps are known to exist; only the Dawson cover (right) bears the 2¢ stamp. The two 13¢ stamps were unusual as they prepaid postage in two countries—Hawaii and the U.S.
