When Red came to the Braves last year, Milwaukee didn't let them down. A great 13 year veteran, his top batting mark was .342 in 1953 at St. Louis.

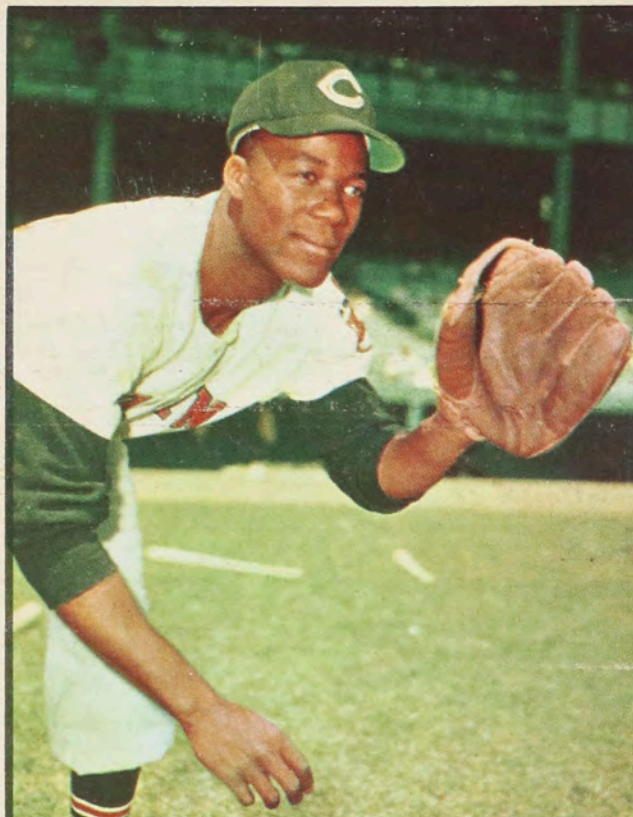

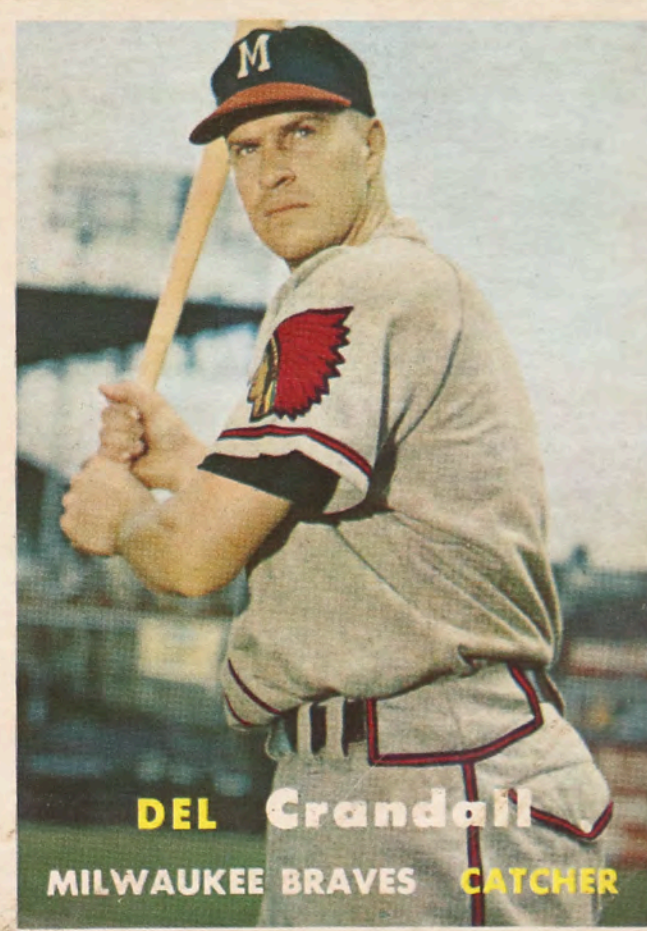
