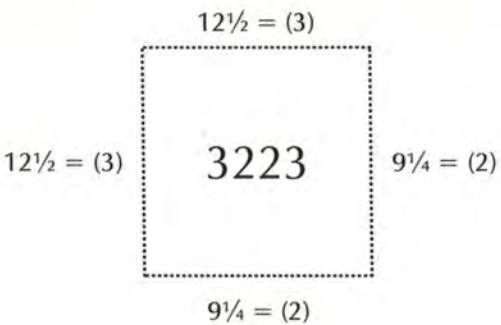

The table at right shows the Coleman perforation designation for each stamp. The six horizontal rows, from top to bottom, are perforated: 12½, 9¼, 6½, 6½, 9¼, and 12½. The eleven vertical columns, from left to right, are perforated: 12½, 9¼, 12½, 9¼, 12½, 6½, 6½, 12½, 6½, 9¼, and 9¼.

To identify a stamp (see the illustration at left), start at the top, assigning Coleman numbers in a clockwise fashion: top, right, bottom, then left.
