


"SKATING ON THE BRANDYWINE" By James Wyeth 1975



Fourth in a series of five annual silver collector's plates. Serially numbered and individually etched by The Franklin Mint in solid sterling silver.



"It was so cold you could almost hear the branches of the trees crackling, and the moon was so bright you could clearly see the hockey puck spinning across the ice. When your hands got too cold, there was always a big bonfire, and somebody would bring marshmallows or wieners to roast. But it was the moonlight which gave the scene that special glowing magic that none of us will ever forget."

It is this special glowing quality that James Wyeth has so masterfully interpreted in "Skating on the Brandywine."

This delightful etching, which appears on the fourth in a series of five annual sterling silver plates by James Wyeth, recaptures a favorite memory of the artist's childhood. The scene is portrayed with all the detailed yet dreamlike quality so often connected with one's fondest recollections.

The medium of sterling silver is ideally suited to complement the subtle interplay of highlights in the beautiful design. The gleaming ice reflects the brilliance of the full moon, darkly accented by the somber branches of winter trees. The silhouetted skaters seem suspended in slow motion, and the glowing flames of the bonfire are captured with the magical touch of James Wyeth's artistry.



Please Note: To preserve the superb finish of your James Wyeth Collector's Plate, we have protected the surface with a fine transparent coating. With normal care, your plate will not tarnish. We recommend that you do *not* use silver cleaner as this will damage the protective coating. Do *not* wash the plate — simply wipe with a soft cloth.
