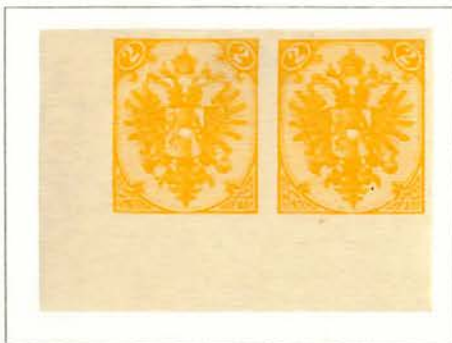

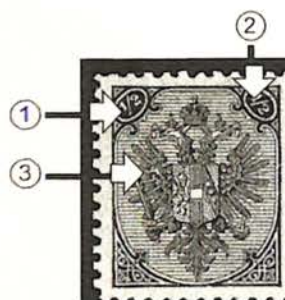

A small cross appears on the right side of the shield — ten times in the sheet — called the "Cross in Shield" (Kreuzchen-type) type. It is designated in the matrix as "⁺B".

A2b(2) • Reprints (1911)

Reprints are characterized by thick, satin paper; clear white gum; duller colors than originals; and, by a line perforation $12\frac{1}{2}$.

Supposedly for the Bern *Weltpostbüro* for distribution to foreign postal administrations.

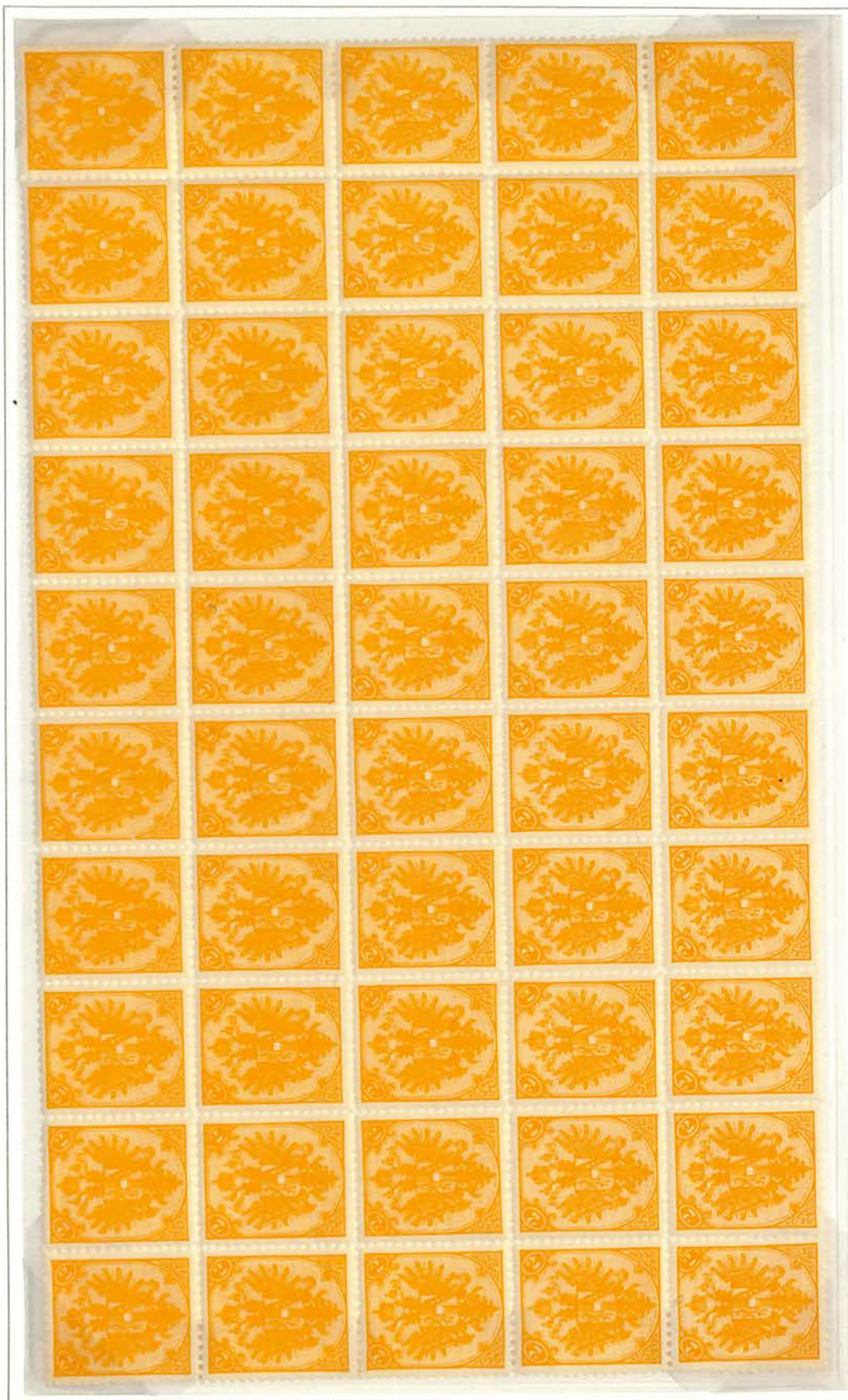

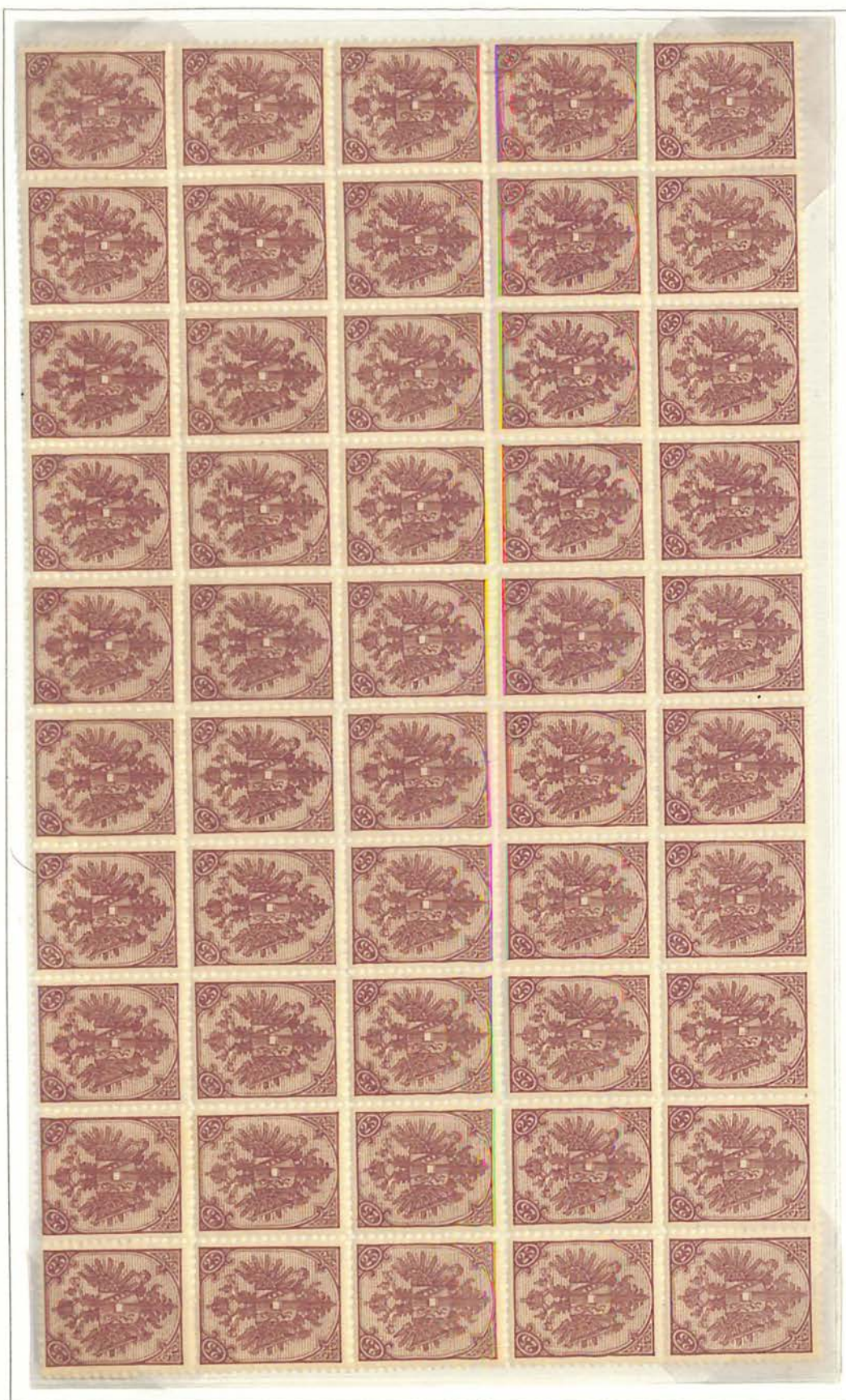

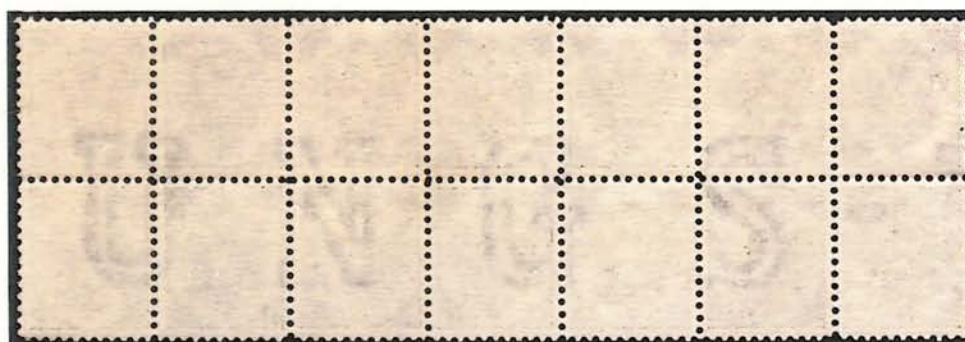

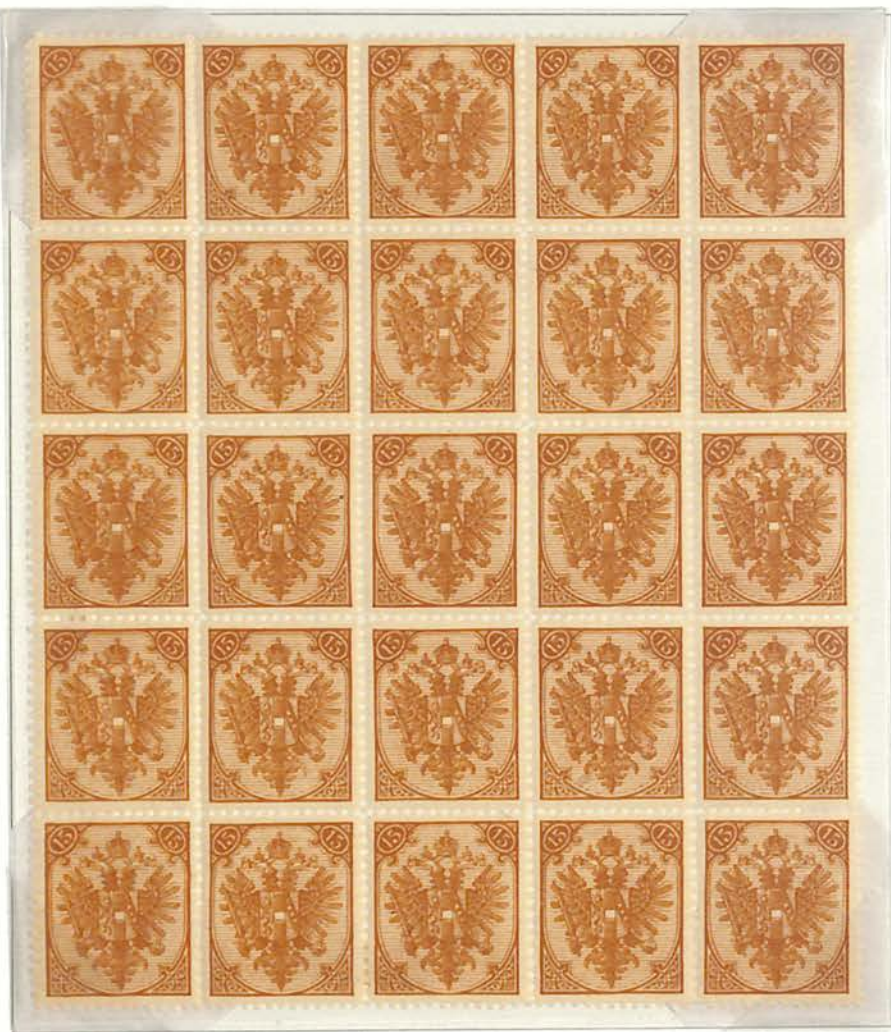

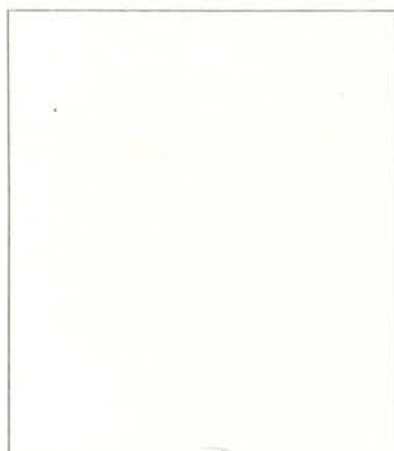

Bottom: Bosanski Brod to Doboj, 1899. Franked with 2(Kr) orange-yellow, **perforated** 10½, canceled "K. UND K. MILIT. POST XXXI, BOS. BROD, 18/7/99" (July 18, 1899).

Bottom: Sarajevo to Vienna, Austria, 1897. Three copies of 5(Kr), perforated 10½, each with "P.L.B." perfin paying 15 kreuzer registration rate to Austria. Canceled "K. UND K. MILIT. POST XXXII, SARAJEVO, 29/12/97" (December 29, 1897).

Sarajevo Local Usage, 1896. ½(Kr), **perforated 10½**, on wrapper, pays the **local delivery rate for newspapers**. Postmarked "K. UND K. MILIT. POST XXXII, SARAJEVO, 27/7/96" (July 27, 1896).

A2c • Usages: Postcard and Lettercard



Sarajevo to Tanga (German East Africa) via Aden, 1898. 2(Kr) strip of three, perforated 10½, pays the 5 kreuzer foreign postal card rate to Africa (overfranked 1 kreuzer). Canceled "K. UND K. MILIT. POST XXXII, SARAJEVO, 20/3/98" (March 20, 1893).

Unusual Destination



Mostar to London, England, 1897. Three kreuzer Letter Card uprated with 2(Kr) orange-yellow and 5(Kr) rose-red, both perforated 10½, making up the 10 kreuzer foreign lettercard rate to England. Canceled "K. UND K. MILIT. POST 13, MOSTAR, 2/10/97" (October 2, 1897).

A2c • 5 Kreuzer Value: Late Use

On January 1, 1900, a new currency was adopted and a new set of definitives issued. **This is a late use of the typographed 5 kreuzer value.** The old typographed stamps were valid until March 31, 1900.



Sarajevo to Munich, Germany, 1900. Two 5(Kr) pay **the new currency 20 heller rate for letter weighing over 20g.** Canceled "K. UND K. MILIT. POST, SARAJEVO, 28.2.1900" (February 28, 1900).

Conversion Rate: 1 Kreuzer = 2 Heller
