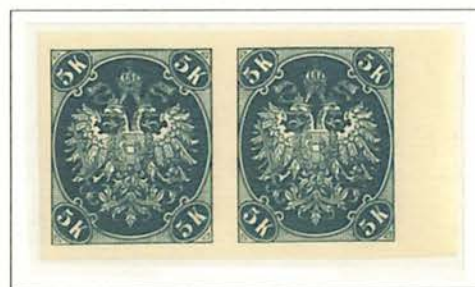

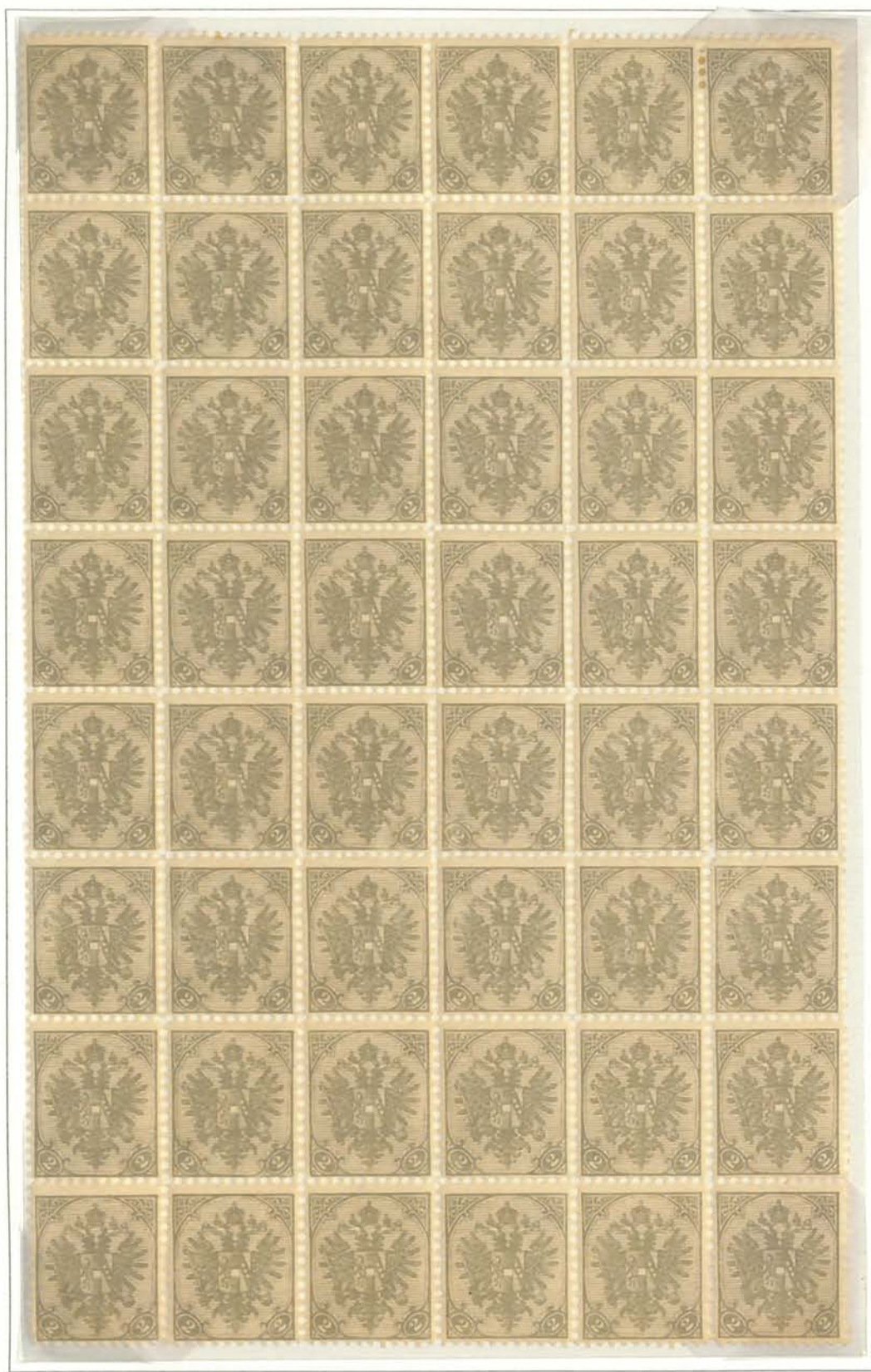

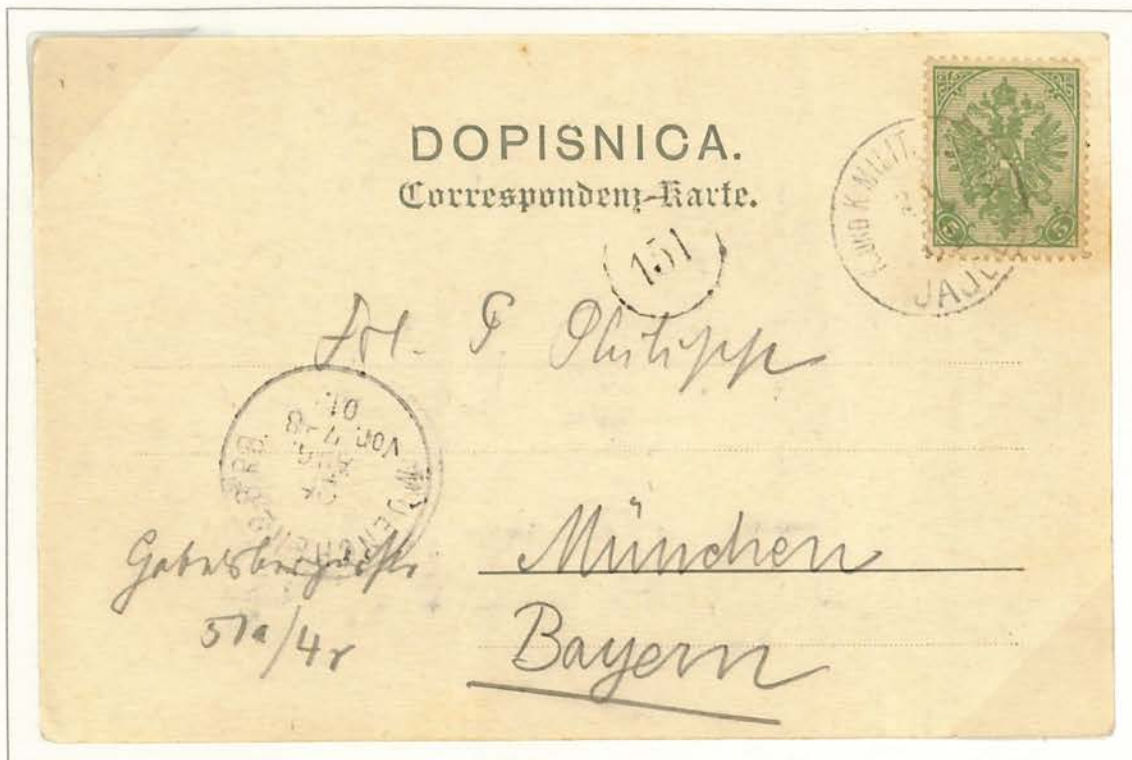

Posted "3/5/01" (May 3, 1901).

B3a • Usages: Uprated Postal Stationery



Brčka to Stockholm, Sweden, 1900. 5(H) blue-green, **perforated 12½**, uprates 5 heller postcard paying the **10 heller postcard rate to Sweden**. Canceled TPO: "MIL. POST-CONDUCTEUR, BRČKA BHF., 25/9/00" (September 25, 1900).



Kalinovic to Bern, Switzerland, 1900. 5(H) green and 10(H) red, both **perforated 12½**, pay the **20 heller lettercard rate to Switzerland**. All canceled "K. UND K. MILIT. POST XLV, KALINOVIK, 7/12/00" (December 7, 1900).

B3a • 5 Heller Value Usage: Diligence Station “Bočac”

A Forerunner to the Imperial Military Post Offices in Bosnia–Herzegovina

In Bosnia, there were three different means of passenger and postal transport: the railway; the military post on the main roads between the larger towns; and, “Diligence” [Wagon] on remote routes. A Diligence was a particularly fast post office vehicle meeting the demands of passengers and the post office.



Jajce to Plauen, 1900. Franked with 5 heller, perforated 12½, paying the **domestic postal lettercard rate**. Posted “K. UND K. MILIT. POST, JAJCE, 8/8/1900” (August 8, 1900).

There was a diligence route between Banjaluka and Jajce which ran through the romantic Vrbas valley. About halfway through, diligence carts would do a horse change. Travelers were able to refresh themselves and also to buy and mail postcards. These cards were stamped “Diligence-Station, Bočac” and were then processed either in Banjaluka or in Jajce at the official post office.

Gravosa to Zug, Switzerland, 1902. Franked with two copies of 3(H), two copies of 1(H), **perforated 12½**, and one copy of 2(H), perforated 10½, making up **10 heller rate for postal card to Switzerland**. Only the three heller values canceled "ZUG / GRAVOSA – SARAJEVO, 16/4/02" (April 16, 1902). The 1(H) and 2(H) values with pen cancellations.
