Vares to Vienna, Austria, 1912. Franked with 2(H) block of 5 paying the **10 heller letter rate to Austria–Hungary**. Posted “K. UND K. MILIT.POST, VAREŠ, 9.X.12” (October 9, 1912).

** Express mail was only possible to locations where there was a military post office. In the case of express delivery outside the location of the destination post office, the recipient had to pay a delivery fee, usually dependent on distance.

Dobož to Esseg, 1909. 5(H) tied by "... MILIT.POST, DOBOŽ, 6/10/09" (October 6, 1909), pays 5 heller Postcard Rate to Austria–Hungary. "ESZÉK-OSIEK" Hungarian-style arrival postmark.



Sarajevo to Esseg, 1910. 5(H) pays Postcard Rate to Austria–Hungary. Canceled "K. UND K. MILIT. POST, SARAJEVO-LAGER, 12/2/10" (February 12, 1910). "ESZÉK-OSIEK" Hungarian-style arrival postmark.

B10b • Domestic and Foreign Postcard Rates



Mostar to Zadar (Zara), 1908. 5(H) green, perforated $12\frac{1}{2}$, pays the 5 heller domestic postcard rate. Canceled with T.P.O. cancel "K. UND K. BAHN-POST II, SARAJEVO–GRAVOSA 109, 7.IX.08" (September 7, 1908).



Ključ to Hong Kong, China, 1908. 5(H) postal card uprated with 5(H) green paying the 10 heller foreign postcard rate. Both canceled "K. UND K. MILIT POST, KLJUČ, 01/11/08" (November 1, 1908).

B10b • 5 Heller Postcard Rate to Austria–Hungary



Domanović to Wien, 1909. 5(H) green, perforated 12½, pays **postcard rate to Austria–Hungary**. Canceled, "K.K. MILIT. POST 2, DOMANOVIC, ??/??/09" (1909).

B10b • Usages: Imperforate Values on Postcards



Sarajevo to Linz, Austria, 1910. 5(H) Postal Card uprated with **imperforate 40(H) orange** making up **45 heller registration rate to Austria–Hungary**. Canceled “K. UND K. MILIT. POST, SARAJEVO, 29.III.10” (March 29, 1910).



*Foča to Vienna, Austria, 1907. Five Kronen, imperforate (with large B margin), overpays the **registered, express rate to Vienna (Austria–Hungary)**. Canceled “K. UND K. MILIT. POST XXXVI, FOČA, 10/11/07” (November 10, 1907).*

B10b • Postcard Usage: Registered, Express Postal Card



Prjedor to Vienna, 1906. Five heller postal card uprated with 1, 2, 3 (x2), 5, 6, 10, and 25 heller values, all perforated $12\frac{1}{2}$. Rate is **60 heller for Postcard to Austria-Hungary: 5 heller Postcard + 25 heller Registration + 30 heller Express.** Canceled "K. UND K. MILIT. POST. PRJEDOR, 1/11/06" (November 1, 1906).

B10b • Letter Card: Express Rate to Hungary



Gravosa-Sarajevo to Budapest, 1909. Ten Heller Letter Card uprated with five copies of 5(H) green, perforated 12½, paying the **40 heller Express rate to Austria–Hungary: 10(H) lettercard + 30 heller Express fee.** Railway cancellation, “K. UND K. GRAVOSA-SARAJEVO 110 / II. VI. 09” (June 11, 1909).

B10c(1) • Letters: 3 Heller Printed Matter Rate



Top: Sarajevo to Halle, Germany, 1909. Franked with 3(H) olive-yellow, perforated 12½. Canceled "K. UND K. MILIT. POST, SARAJEVO, 7.1X.09" (October 7, 1909).

Right: Bos. Novi to Germany, 1907. Picture post card franked with 3(H) olive-yellow, perforated 12½. Canceled "K. UND K. MILIT. POST, BOS. NOVI, 16/VI/07" (June 16, 1907).

Doberlin to Mitrovitz (Mitrovica), 1906. Franked with block of 10 of the 1(H) black, perforated $12\frac{1}{2}$, paying the **10 heller domestic single letter rate**. Canceled "K. UND K. MILIT. POST LXVI, DOBERLIN, 27/12/06" (December 27, 1906).

B10c(2) • Letters: 10 Heller Single Letter Rates



Gračanica to Trieste, 1910. Franked with **margin copy of 6(H) brown imperforate** plus 1(H) black and 3(H) olive-yellow, both perforated 12½, paying **10 heller domestic single letter rate**. Canceled "K. UND K. MILIT. POST XIX, GRAČANICA, 12/2/10" (February 12, 1910).



Sarajevo to Szabadka, Hungary, 1910. **5(H) imperforate pair** pays **10 heller domestic single letter rate**. Canceled "K. UND K. MILIT. POST, SARAJEVO, ??/??/??". Arrival, "SZABADKA" (Hungary), "910 APR.17.N11" (April 17, 1910).

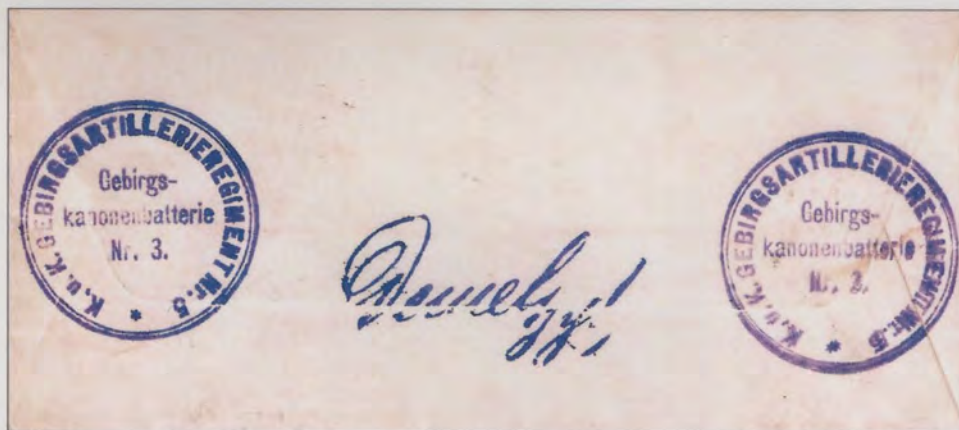
B10c(2) • Letter: 10 Heller Letter Rate to Prague



Bos. Novi to Prague, 1910. Franked with five copies of 2(H) violet, perforated $12\frac{1}{2}$, paying the **10 heller single letter rate to Prague (Austria)**. Posted "K. UND K. MILIT. POST, BOS. NOVI, 4 VIII. 10" (August 4, 1910). Officially sealed at the Imperial Post Office in Prague.

Nevesinje to Teschen (Bohemia), 1912. **10(H)** single franking pays letter rate to **Austria–Hungary**. Canceled “K. UND K. MILIT:POST 3, NEVESINJE, 1/7/12” (July 1, 1912).

Military Letter from the “Gebirgskanonenbatterie Nr. 3.” of the “K.u.K. GEBIRGS-ARTILLERIE REGIMENT Nr. 5” (Mountain Cannon Battery No. 3 of the Imperial Mountain Artillery Regiment, No. 5)

Single Franking

B10c(3) • Letter: 25 Heller Foreign Letter Rate



Ilidže to Birmingham, England, 1909. 3(H) olive-yellow (x1), 5(H) blackish-green (x2), and 6(H) brown (x2) — all perforated $12\frac{1}{2}$ — make up 25 heller foreign letter rate to England. Canceled "K. UND K. MILIT. POST LXIV, ILIDŽE, 20/6/09" (June 20, 1909).
