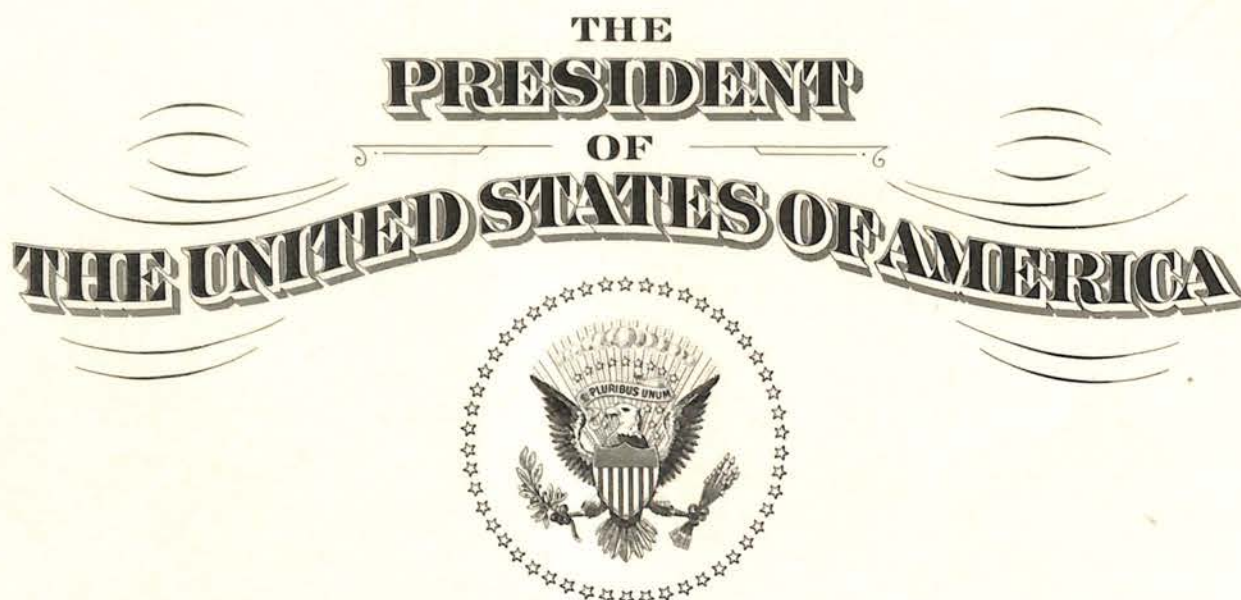




To all who shall see these presents, greeting:

may be given by the President of the United States of America, or other superior
officers, acting in accordance with the laws of the United States of America.

This commission is to continue in force during the pleasure of the President of
the United States of America, under the provisions of those public laws relating to
officers of the **Armed Forces of the United States of America**
and the component thereof in which this appointment is made.

First Banking House, Boston (1784)

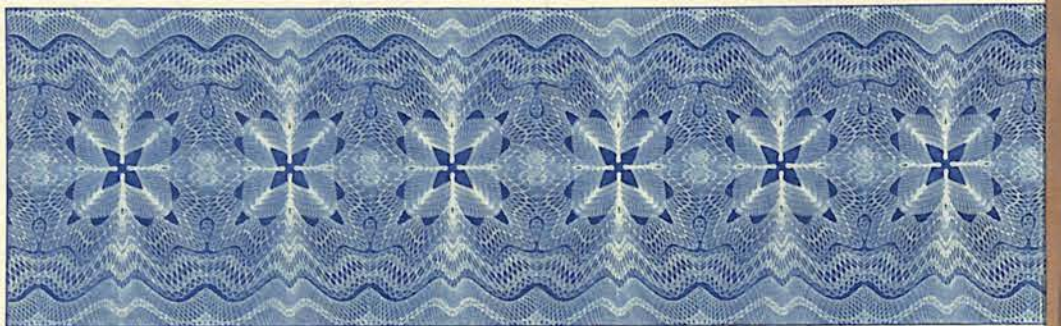

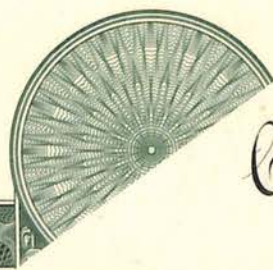

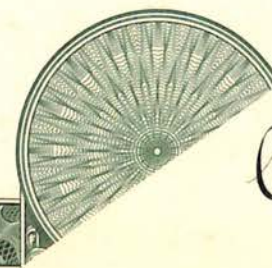
