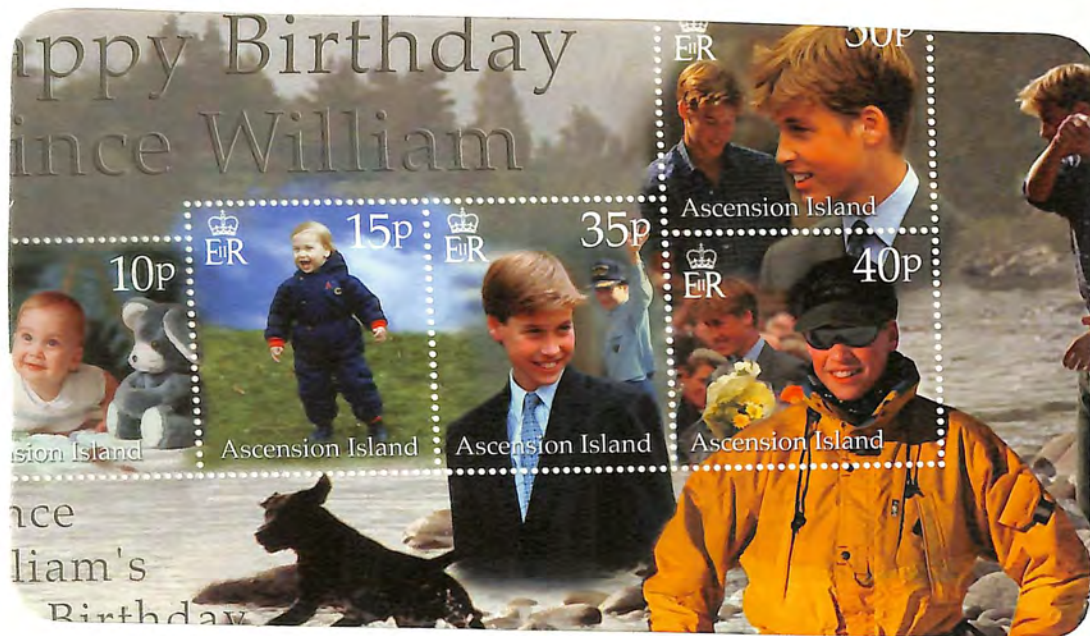

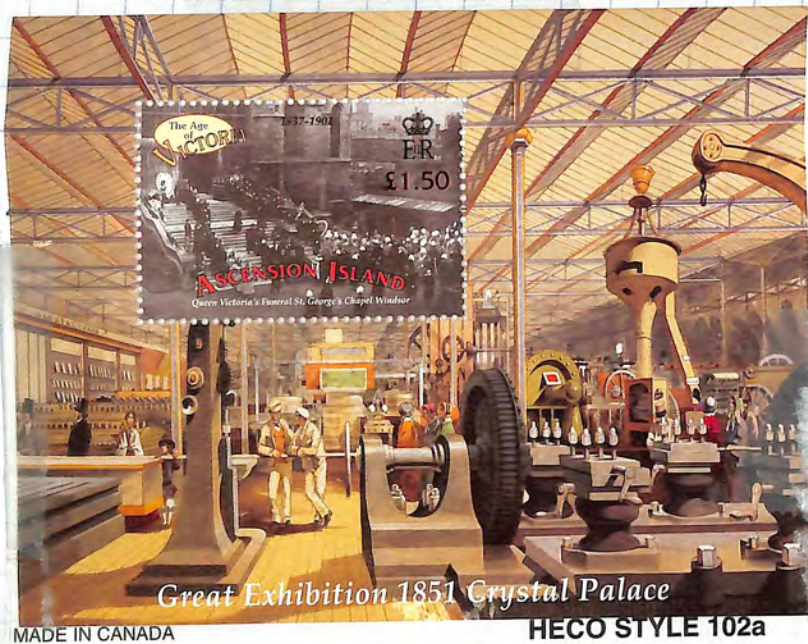

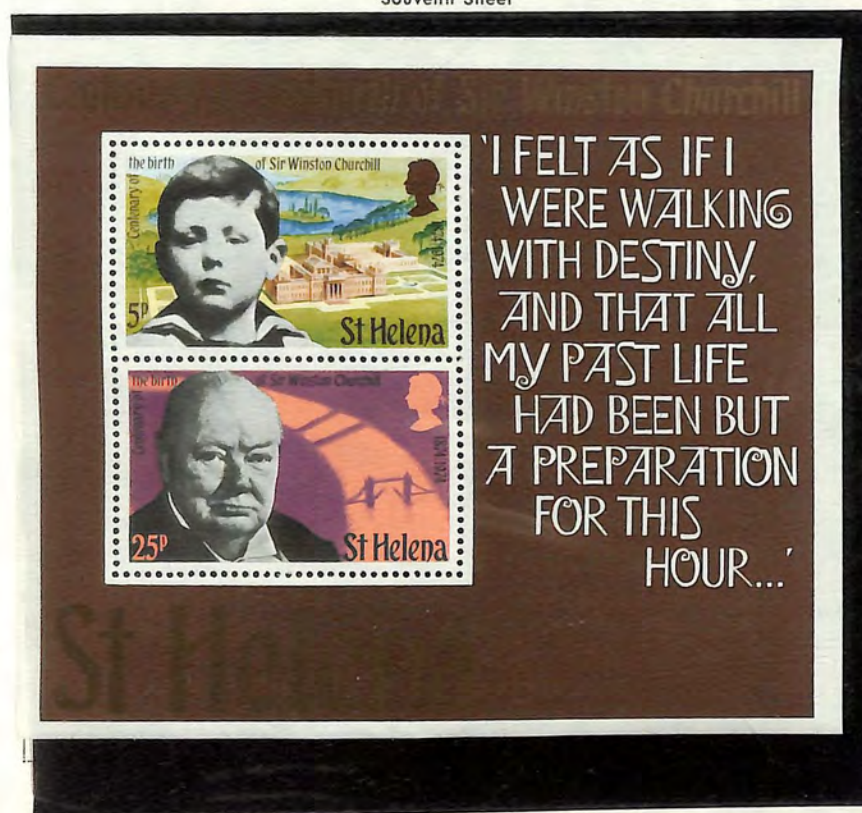

Wellington returned to England from India in 1805 because of ill health and called at St Helena en route. He spent a month at the Briars and the stay did much to restore his health. He described the climate as "the most healthy I have ever lived in". Ten years later Wellington's greatest opponent, Napoleon, occupied this same house, the Pavilion at the Briars, while Wellington took over Napoleon's Palace in Paris. In a letter to Admiral Malcolm the Commander-in-Chief St Helena in 1816, Wellington wrote "You may tell 'Bony' that I find his apartments at the Élysée Bourbon, very convenient and I hope he

Postal stones of St. Helena

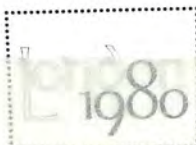
In the 17th Century, when outward bound vessels called for fresh water and provisions, the crews would bury their letters, despatches and news at certain spots marked by large square stones.

These 'postal stones' had the names of the ships, their Commanders and Masters, and other

relevant information engraved on them. The crews of returning vessels would search for these stones to obtain news of

their homes and countrymen.

One of the earliest known 'postal stones' is dated 1645 and carries the message that the ship *Dolphin*, with Will Fremien as Commander and John Prowd as Master landed at St. Helena on March 21st and departed on May 18th.

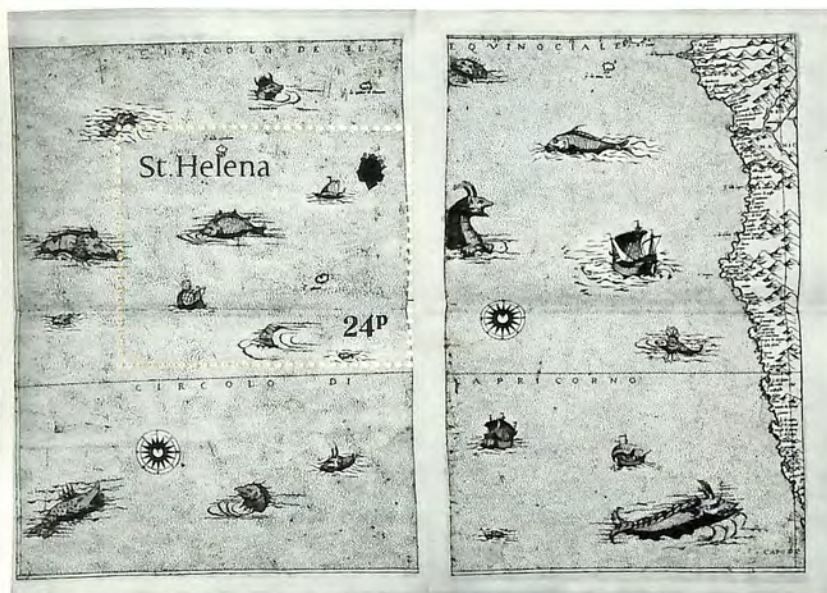
This portrait of Wellington by Francisco de Goya was painted in 1812, when Wellington entered Madrid after winning the Battle of Salamanca. He was at this time a member of three Orders of Knighthood – the Bath, the Tower and Sword of Portugal, and San Fernando of Spain – and he wears their badges in this portrait. While in Madrid he received the Order of the Golden Fleece and Goya altered the original painting in order to show it. Further alterations were made in 1814 so as to include the Military Gold Cross and the three clasps, which were sent to Wellington in Spain in 1813.

The 1¢ Z grill now owned by Mystic Stamp
pany was discovered by William Stevenson in
1915 or 1916 and remained a part of his collection
until his death. The stamp surfaced again in 1957,
when world-famous philatelic expert Lester G.
Brookman acquired the stamp from Henry
Kuhlmann and Carl Subak. Brookman sold the
stamp to Wilbur Schilling.

When the Schilling collection was sold in 1975,
the 1¢ Z grill was sold through Siegel Auction Gal-
leries at the price of \$42,500.00 – its current Scott
value had been \$25,000.00. In 1977, the stamp was
sold at a Sotheby's auction for \$90,000.00 (double
its Scott value at that time) to Superior Stamp and
Coin Company, who sold it to Dr. Jerry Buss of
Beverly Hills. When the Buss collection was sold,
it smashed all records, fetching \$418,000.00 –
\$308,000.00 over its Scott value. The stamp broke
the record for the price paid for a single U.S. stamp
when it was sold to Mystic Stamp Company.

St Helena was a real person but the stories depicted on the windows are a medieval mixture of both history and legend. St Helena is important in church history for two things; she was the mother of the first Christian Emperor of the Roman Empire, Constantine The Great, and on her pilgrimage to the Holy Land tradition credits her with discovering the site of the major holy places, the manger at Bethlehem and the Holy Sepulchre at Jerusalem.

"Hic Nascitur Elena Coyle Regis Filia"

In John Capgrave's 'Nova Legenda Angliae' Helena was believed to be the daughter of King Cole (of nursery rhyme fame). She was in fact born about 255 AD at the Drepanum later renamed Helenopolis after her.

"Hic Elena (in art) bus (liberalibus) (et) in misich sijt instruend"

Helena had a reputation for great learning and is shown here being taken to a convent school by her parents to be educated in liberal studies.

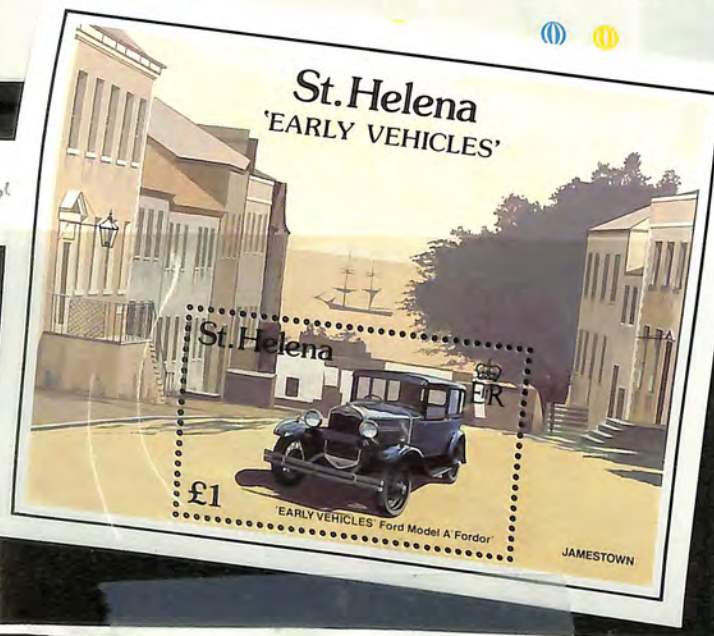

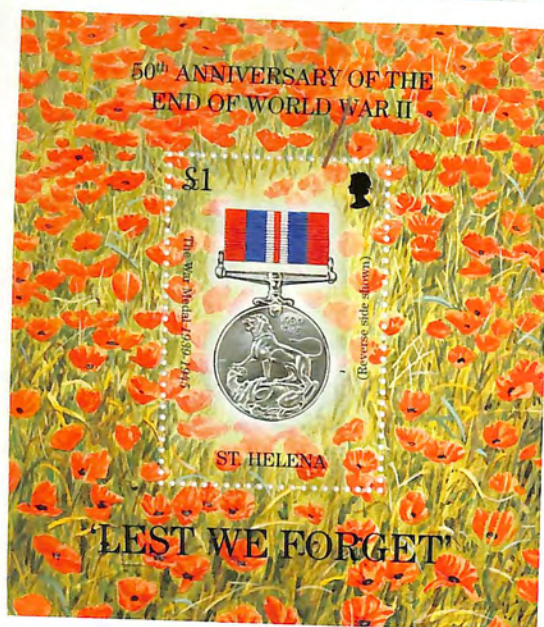
