Austrian stamps with Hungarian cancellation

This letter, with inprinted stamp, was mailed on January 21, 1872 from Perlak, county of Zala (today: Prelog, in Jugoslavia), to Kreutz in Croatia (the croatian name is Krizevci, and the Hungarian name Körös; it was in the county of Belovár-Körös) where it arrived on the next day. As seen in the back-cancellation, the canceller used in Kreutz had the name of the town in Croatian.

Austrian stamps with Hungarian cancellation.

The independent

Royal Hungarian Post

began on May 1, 1867 using the Austrian stamps issued 1863, so these are the only true forerunners for Hungary. On June 1, 1867 the new set was issued which is actually a common issue for Austria and Hungary. From 1867 to 1871 the two independent postal administration used the stamps. Only the kr. value which could be read Hungarian „krajcár” or German „kreuzer” appears on the stamps. This issue—but only the coarse print—was valid from 1867 to July 31, 1871 in Hungary.

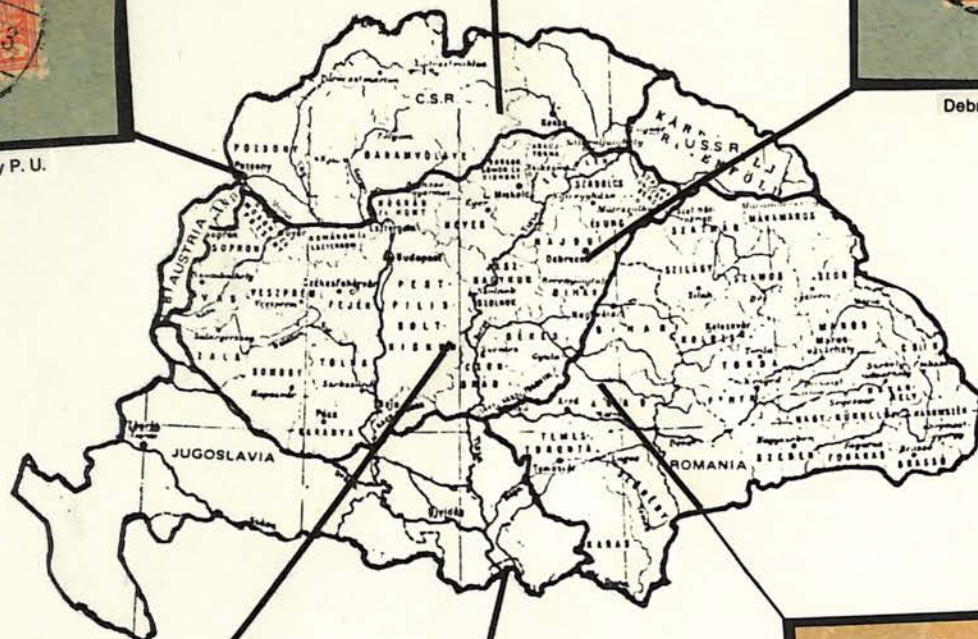
